

## Read, Learn, and Bead! ✨

Read a nonfiction book. Choose one square on the Nonfiction Choice Board to demonstrate your new book knowledge! **Bring your completed activity to the library during specials to get your bead each week!** You can earn as many beads as you want! How many will you earn this year?! 💎 Earn a **gold or silver bead** for every 25 Accelerated Reader (AR) points you earn. RULES: Label your work with your name and Grade. Only 1 bead can be earned for a book. Compare and Contrast earns you two beads, but you must read two books. You can not use the same book for more than one bead. Work must be nice and neat because we are proud of our work. If you lose your beads, you must start over. It is your responsibility to keep your beads in a safe place. Keep reading and let's see how many beads you can earn! How many will you have in May?

<p><b>Wow! Writer</b> Write or tell me in a paragraph the things you learned that made you say "Wow!" and explain why it was so surprising. You must write a complete paragraph with at least 8 sentences. You may use your own or pick up a 3.8 sheet from Mrs. Urbahns.</p>	<p><b>Poster Pro</b> Make a small poster that includes: the title, author, illustrator/photographer, which library genre the book is part of, author's purpose, 3 words that best describe this book, your rating, and recommendation, and three facts you learned.</p>	<p><b>Fact Finder/Brochure</b> Choose 1. On an index card or piece of paper, write down 3 cool facts you learned from the book and draw an illustration of your book's topic. <b>Brochures</b> should be folded into 3 sections. Include pictures that are hand drawn, the title, 3 cool facts, why others should read the book, and what do you still want to learn?</p>
<p><b>Dynamic Diorama</b> Create a 3D replica demonstrating what you learned from your book. Include a brief description in your own words explaining your 3D creation.</p>	<p><b>Vocabulary Star</b> Pick three new words you learned from the book. Write down each word, its definition in your own words, and use it in a new sentence. Include an illustration of each word. Be sure to include the book title and author. You may also include a picture of the book cover that you draw.</p>	<p><b>Diagram Designer</b> Pick one topic from the book and draw a labeled diagram or picture. Be sure to include at least three labels and a short description explaining the diagram. You may also choose to use the text feature template from Mrs. Urbahns (pick one up in the library).</p>
<p><b>Create a Comic Strip</b> Create a 3-4 square comic strip to demonstrate what you've learned. Be creative!</p>	<p><b>Compare &amp; Contrast</b> Read 2 nonfiction books and compare and contrast what is the same and different about them. You may draw your own Venn Diagram or pick up one of the compare and contrast sheets in the library.</p>	<p><b>Illustrate a Word:</b> Choose one new vocabulary word from the book. Draw a picture that helps explain what the word means. Include a caption explaining the drawing. You may pick up a Word Web template to help or design your own illustration.</p>
