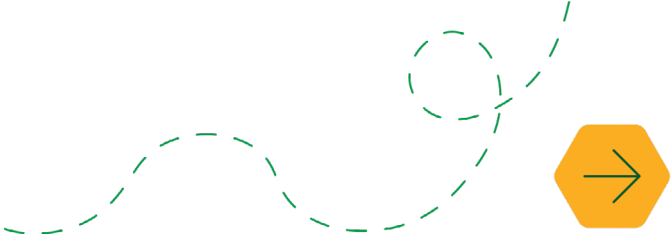

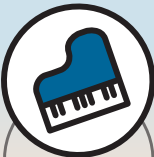

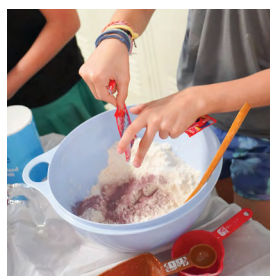
Kool-Aid Play Dough

Finding Their Stride

Edina Middle School Track & Field Creates Community One Step at a Time

At both South View and Valley View Middle Schools, the Edina Middle School Track and Field program has become more than just a sport—it’s a launching pad for young athletes to discover their potential, build lasting friendships, and develop leadership skills.

“There is a place for everyone on our team,” says Jenny Harrits, head coach at South View for three years. “This program is a place to belong. A track team is unique in that we need a wide variety of people with different strengths to be successful.”

At Valley View, Jon Buckley has been coaching since 2003. When morning practice times were introduced—a change many thought would hurt participation—the opposite happened. “Instead, we’ve nearly doubled our numbers since then!”

Building Community and Character

The program creates an environment where every achievement matters. At South View, Harrits celebrates personal records with the ring of a PR bell. “The smile on the face of a kid who just got to ring the PR bell is priceless,” she says.

Both coaches emphasize leadership development through their captain system. “It’s exciting to think about these young men and women and the work ethic and positive leadership they are going to bring into our world,” Harrits reflects. Buckley agrees: “I also admire the leadership growth that our captains show throughout the season. Our students are amazing!” The program teaches goal-setting and perseverance while building community. “We start our days together lifting one another up and challenging each other to do our best—whatever that might look like,” Harrits explains. For Buckley, the program gives students “a chance to be physically fit, learn about track, connect with others

by being an important part of our team and have lots of fun.”

Of course, there’s friendly competition too. Harrits notes that “for two years in a row, the South View boys have brought home the Golden Toilet trophy. This year, we’re on the hunt for the Golden Lamp, the girls’ trophy, as well. Watch out Valley View and Buck!”

Both coaches understand they’re helping shape young people during a crucial developmental period. As Harrits puts it: “Every morning I walk off the field with a huge smile on my face. These kids are so fun and positive.”

For middle schoolers facing academic pressures and social challenges, the Edina Middle School Track and Field program offers something invaluable: a place to belong, grow, and discover what they’re capable of achieving—one stride at a time.

Community Service Letter Program

Edina High School students entering grades 9-12 can earn a letter in Community Service. Students can earn a letter by making a difference by serving their community and others.

Here are the steps required to earn a Community Service Letter:

1. Join the Community Service Letter Schoology page
2. Attend an in-person orientation (October)
3. Complete an application (due Friday, December 12, 2025)
4. Complete 120 hours of service with at least 60 hours addressing a specific social issue. Hours must be completed by Friday, April 3, 2026
5. By the April deadline, students will submit the following materials on Schoology:
 - Hours log demonstrating 120 hours of service
 - One letter of recommendation from a supervisor with an organization you volunteered with
 - Create a Creative Reflection artifact that represents your service work
6. Students share the creative artifact and service experiences in a reflection showcase with peers (April 2026).

Exploring Tomorrow's Possibilities Today

A student traveled to Costa Rica for an unpaid internship studying leaf cutter ants and their naturally-produced antibiotics. Through a partnership with Genesys Works, a dozen students were placed in year-long Information Technology internships at companies including Target, Optum, Best Buy, Ecolab, and UnitedHealth Group. Another student attended the Congress of Future Medical Leaders conference in Boston, meeting Nobel Prize-winning molecular geneticist Mario Capecchi. Others volunteered to serve students with disabilities, library patrons, and immigrants and refugees.

These are just a few of the opportunities Edina High School students have embraced in the past year, discovering possibilities that may one day lead to college or career. And meaningful explorations like these matter: research consistently demonstrates that hands-on career exploration reduces anxiety about the future, builds confidence, and allows students to identify passions while they still have time to adjust their educational focus—increasing student engagement and sense of purpose in school.

With the support of a grant from Minnesota's Department of Labor and Industry, Edina's Community Education and Strategic Partnership team is working to make a robust and varied menu of hands-on career exploration opportunities accessible for more students. We're organizing community partners who will offer panel presentations, career fairs, field trips, informational

Building Bridges

How Edina Community Education Strengthens Social Emotional Learning

“Academic learning and social emotional learning depend on one another, and students can’t discover their possibilities and thrive if we lose focus on either one,” says Cheryl Gunness, Community Engagement Programs Supervisor. “That’s why Community Ed is taking steps to formally implement the CASEL (Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning) frameworks across all of our programs.”

The CASEL framework is already widely adopted throughout the Edina Public Schools school day. Extending the framework into out of school time programs ensures that students hear the same language and receive consistent support all day, every day. “Having consistent language and the opportunity to practice social emotional learning skills in various settings helps students recognize that these skills are life skills that can be used anywhere,” explains Sarah Hilligoss-Moe, MTSS and Extended Learning Coordinator.

What is Social Emotional Learning?

According to CASEL, Social and Emotional Learning is the process through which all young people and adults acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to:

- develop healthy identities
- manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals
- feel and show empathy for others
- establish and maintain supportive relationships
- and make responsible and caring decisions.

A Natural Fit for Community Education

While the formal adoption of CASEL frameworks may be new, the principles have always been at the heart of community education programming.

“Community Education has always been all about belonging, connection, curiosity, and helping learners develop interests and a sense of purpose,” says Gunness. “Now we have a formal way to connect what we are doing to what’s happening in the school day, including common language and shared staff training.”

Three Signature Practices

Three signature CASEL practices will help organize all Edina Community Education programs:

Inclusive Welcome to Build Community:

Every program begins with intentional community-building activities that help students feel welcomed and valued.

Engaging Practices: Programs incorporate student voice and choice, encouraging collaboration and active participation.

Intentional Close: Each session ends with intentional reflection that helps students process their experiences and connect them to future learning.

Innovative Programming Enhancements

The signature practices are evident in programs like Kids Club, where each day begins with

grade-level meetings that welcome students, followed by choice-driven activities supported by trained staff who prioritize making every child feel safe, seen, and heard. This year, Kids Club staff is taking SEL integration even further with direct instruction. Kids Club staff have selected one CASEL competency to focus on each month, and they'll deliver two mini-lessons that reinforce these competencies in the after-school setting.

A Community-Wide Approach

The commitment to SEL excellence extends to external partnerships as well. To continue this support into the home environment, the monthly Kids Club family newsletter now includes explanations of each competency and practical suggestions for parents to help their children practice these essential skills at home. The vendors who provide enrichment programming receive training and support to ensure that they understand and implement the signature practices, as will community volunteers. “As a community, and as a team, we are here to help make sure our students belong and are seen and heard,” emphasizes Hilligoss-Moe. Through intentional planning, shared language, and comprehensive training, Edina Community Education is demonstrating that when schools and community programs work together with a common vision, students benefit from a robust system of support that prepares them for both academic success and meaningful, connected lives in their community.



Here are five ways families can support their children in strengthening social-emotional competencies:

Model and Discuss Emotions: Families can help children with Self-Awareness and Self-Management by openly talking about their own feelings and sharing healthy coping strategies. For example, a parent could say, “I’m feeling a little frustrated right now. I’m going to take a deep breath to calm down.”

Practice Active Listening and Empathy: To strengthen Social Awareness and Relationship Skills, families can practice active listening by giving their full attention and validating their child’s feelings. They can also use “I wonder” statements to encourage empathy, such as “I wonder how your friend felt when you shared your toy with them.”

Engage in Family Decision-Making: Families can foster Responsible Decision-Making by including children in age-appropriate family choices, like deciding on a weekend activity or dinner menu. This provides a low-stakes environment for them to practice weighing options and considering consequences.

Participate in Service or Community Activities: Families can support Social Awareness and Kindness by engaging in service projects. This helps children understand different perspectives and the importance of contributing to the well-being of others. Examples include volunteering at a local food bank or helping a neighbor.

Create Routines for Connection and Reflection: To support Relationship Skills and Self-Management, families can establish consistent routines for daily connection and reflection. This could be a daily check-in during dinner where everyone shares a “high” and a “low” from their day, building trust and providing a safe space for communication and problem-solving.

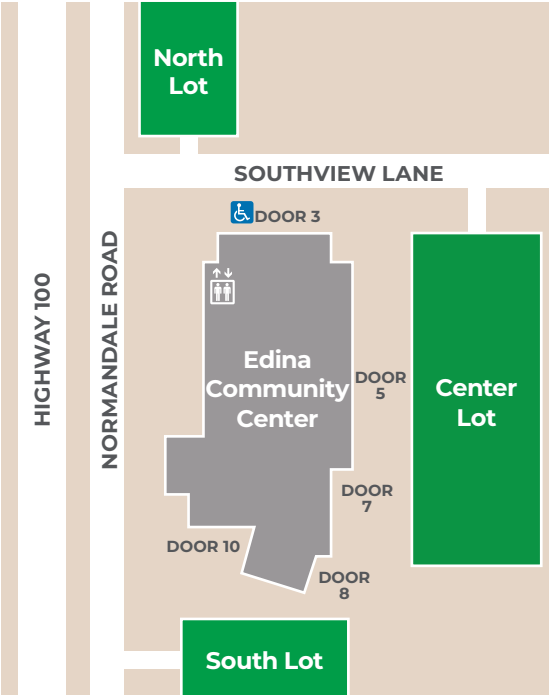
