Weighted Grades

Since the 1995-96 school year, Advanced Placement (AP) courses began to be weighted. The weight will be .333. For example, a grade of B+ in an advanced placement course will receive the grade points of an A-. Only grades of B- and above will be weighted.

Dual Credit Requirements

- A required 3.0 cumulative GPA at the time of enrollment. If a student has less than a 3.0, they must have a signed letter from their parents and school administration. 9th grade students must have a 3.0 and score in the 90th percentile on the ACT (33 composite).
- Lincoln University requires students to pass the math placement test with a score of 23 (for Statistics), 31 (for Col Alg), 31 (for Precalculus) and 48 (for Calculus) - or have an ACT math subscore of 18 (for Statistics), 22 (for Col Alg), 22 (for Precalculus) and 30 (for Calculus).
- Any 9th grade students wishing to enroll in Dual Enrollment classes must have a 3.0 GPA, score in the 90th percentile on the ACT, and have a signed letter of recommendation from both the school and the parents/guardians.
- Lincoln University requires an 18 on the English section of the ACT for English 101 and a C or higher in English 101 to be eligible for English 102.
