What classes can I take? How many classes can I take?

You may only take a class that is not offered by Williamston High School or is offered but unavailable due to a scheduling conflict. The class cannot be in the areas of hobby/craft, recreation, PE, theology, divinity, or religion.

Students in grades 9 or 10 can only take two total concurrent and dual enrollment courses during their first year, and cannot take more than four courses during their remaining years of high school. A student in grades 11 or 12 cannot take more than six courses per year. Students are limited to ten total concurrent and dual enrollment courses during their high school years. They

also must be enrolled in at least one class at their home high school.

WHS will award a half credit (.5) for the successful completion of a postsecondary approved class. College classes taken for high school credit may appear on your transcript as either credit or can be calculated into your GPA based on the weighted AP grading scale. Unless otherwise requested, the school will choose the option that is best for your GPA.

What is the cost?

Williamston High School will pay up to \$725.00 per class toward tuition and mandatory course fees, including technology fees, material fees, and any late fees. WHS is not responsible for transportation, books, parking, or most activity fees. Be aware that costs may be higher for students who live outside of Ingham County. Check the college/university website for cost per credit hour for in-county versus out-of-county. High school students are not eligible for financial aid and are financially responsible for any amount not paid by Williamston High School. Students who do not complete or pass their dual enrollment course are responsible for repaying WHS any money the school district paid for the course. If the money is not repaid, Williamston Community Schools may impose sanctions per district policy.

What now? How do I get started?

- 1. Complete the concurrent and/or dual enrollment application process for the postsecondary school where you will be taking the class.
- 2. Be sure to follow the college's registration calendar. Their deadlines will be different from those of Williamston High School!
- 3. During WHS scheduling, sign up for Concurrent Enrollment and/or Dual Enrollment.
- 4. Complete and submit the required forms to the Counseling Office. For WHS, you need to complete the Concurrent & Dual Enrollment Commitment Form below.
- 5. Be aware that postsecondary classes MUST be pre-approved by the high school prior to enrollment EACH semester!

It is the responsibility of the student to apply to the postsecondary institution and register for his/her class(es) through the postsecondary institution. The student must coordinate the postsecondary class(es) with his/her high school schedule. We recommend taking online courses as these work best with our school day.
