The class officers were elected as follows: Pres. Robert Martin, V. Pres. James Eaker, Sec. Dorothy Parrish and Treas. Essie Kelly. Our cheerleaders were Elizabeth Sullivan and Paul Wright.

Then followed the second year in our school career. We started as "Silly Sophomores". Mrs. Robert Dillard was our sponsor. The class officers were elected as follows: Pres. Bill Willoughby, V. Pres. Jackie Hays, Sec. Glenna Hackney and Treas. Robert Agee. Our cheerleaders were Robert Martin and Paul Wright. We had been in school only a few weeks when we heard on October 23, that the school had been completely destroyed by fire. We went back to school in the Presbyterian Church. Some students enrolled in other schools but most of them were loyal to their old Alma Mater.

It seemed to be no time until we were actually "Jolly Juniors". Now the Freshmen were eyeing us respectfully; the Sophomores were eyeing us enviously the Seniors were eyeing us haughtily and the teachers were just eyeing us. The class officers were elected as follows: Pres. Thomas Rice, V. Pres. Tom Marshall, Sec. Grace Vivrette, and Treas. Robert Agee. Our sponsors were Mrs. Rufus Riggan and Mr. Walter Swain. Our cheerleaders were Dorothy Parrish and Hazel Smith. The high-light of the year was the Junior-Senior Banquet

At last, we arrived at our goal, Seniors in Mt. Juliet High School. With twenty-seven students in our senior class, we have tried to make up in quality what we have lacked in quantity. Our sponsors were Mrs. Ridley Kenton and Mr. O. H. Wright. As officers we elected Pres. Carl Prentice, V. Pres. Bill Willoughby, Sec. Marjorie Hewgley and Treas. Robert Agee. Our cheerleader was Helen Lannom.

Our class was very active in sports. On the football squad we placed (Captain) Jackie Hays, (Co-Captain) James Eakes, Edmund Agee, Robert Martin and Bill Willoughby.

On the girls basketball team there were Grace Vivrette, Alice Moss, Glenn Hackney, Dorothy Parrish and Lois Jackson.

On the boys basketball team there were Carl Prentice, Jackie Hays, Robert Joe Martin and James Eakes, with Edmund Agee acting as manager. Paul Wright is also on the team.

We are proud of our achievements as well as sad at the thoughts of leaving all our friends with whom we have spent so much time. Although the time has come for us to part, we always have one interest in common, the achievements of Mt. Juliet High our Alma Mater.
