### Boys indoor track:

This has been an outstanding season for Boys Indoor Track: We sent 12 runners to The TFCAofGP Meet of Champions, at The Ott Center at U of P on Feb. 15, our Districts, with Nationals yet to come. Luke Moyer has set three new school records and with our 4x2 (R. Wise, G. Dhunjisha, D. Andreadis, A. Williams, and L. Moyer) has re-set our school record multiple times; and our school record setting 4x4 relay: E. Kelly, R. D'Ambrosio, N. Holt, C. Reynolds, and A Williams set the record at the MOC! Luke ran the 60 and the 200, Alex Williams in the 400 and Jimmy Murphy in the 800, joined our two relays!

**Cheerleading:** This season, the cheerleaders won the UCA regional competition for the second year in a row. The team also qualified for state competition at district 1, scoring in the top 5 out of 20 small varsity teams. At nationals, both traditional and game day varsity competed in the preliminary and semi-finals rounds!

**Girls Indoor Track:** The girl's indoor season started amazing and ended even better!!! The girls had an opportunity to etch their names onto the new record board by breaking 11 school records!!!! **Wrestling:** Marple High School Wrestling team finished with a 9-14 record this year. Team accomplishments on the year was tied for 2nd place finish at the Haverford High School Dual meet tournament. Individual accomplishments on the year are as followed:

**Girls swim:** The Lady Tigers battled a good season. Having a win of the season against Upper Darby. To end the season out we had 3 ladies Qualify for districts this year. Sophie Yacoubian, Ava Droesser and Katie Snyder.

**Divng:** The MN Divers had a great season. Senior Captains Alex Koulas, Logan Leach, and Delaney Behl led the team to multiple top 3 finishes. Underclassmen Riley Leach, Reed Pennington and Stavros Koulas also had strong seasons, with Reed scoring a personal best 189.75. Way to go!

**Boys swim:** The Tiger Men had a terrific season from start to finish in the pool. They doubled their win total compared to last season with two near wins against teams with three times the number of swimmers. Additionally, every swimmer improved. For the season there were 62 personal bests in individual events with a nearly equal number for the relay events. When the post season started MN had many great performances. In the Central League Silver Championship, there were 9 podium finishes including one first place and two second place finishes. At the Central League Championship, MN earned three podium finishes to include a 2nd and 4th in the 50 and 100 freestyle, respectively by MN's fastest swimmer in history, Pat Droesser. At the District Championship, Pat Droesser had a podium finish that also qualified him for the State Championship meet. Finally, Pat also set a new school record in the 100 Freestyle, breaking his previous record from last season. He is still going as states are coming up.

**Girls basketball:** Girls basketball won a playoff game and became the 3rd MN girls basketball team to ever do that. They won 5 of the last 6 to get in the playoffs. They finished 1 game away from making states. Olivia Gicking was 2nd team All CAL. She has 100 3's in 2 years so far. Taylor Murrin was Honorable Mention ALL CAL. Captains were Rowan Hilden, Taylor Murrin and Olivia Gicking.

**Boys basketball :**Boys' basketball advanced to the PIAA State tournament for just the third time in school history. The team finished the regular season with a 16-6 record (3rd best regular season record ever) made the Central League playoffs where they won they first round game, then lost in the semifinals, made the PIAA District playoffs and won in the playbacks to earn a bid to States (three times in the 106<sup>th</sup> year the tournament has been played). There were many highlights and key moments throughout the season. Among them were our All-Central League award winners. Junior Jackson Burger received Honorable Mention, senior Ryan Keating made 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-Central and senior Matt Gardler was 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Central and named Central League MVP. This is the second year in a row Matt Gardler won Central League MVP. We lost in the state playoffs to Nuemann Goretti 79-67. Matt Gardler set the MNHS record for points in a career with 1,630 points!

**Ice Hockey:** MNHIC finished its run with a 7-6 OT loss to West Chester Henderson in the quarterfinals of the 2025 Flyers Cup. With an overall record this season of 10-4 in the regular season and finishing 4<sup>th</sup> overall in the Central League. The team built off of its success from the last two seasons as it tempted to make another run at the Central League title along with the Flyers Cup, just falling short in two overtime games. The team looks forward to rebounding next year, but will miss the leadership of its Seniors, especially its Varsity starters Ethan McKay, Tyler Newby, and Sam Caroluzzi.
