**Boys track and field:**

The MN Men of Track had an amazing season. At the CAL championship meet we won four medals by Jim Murphy, Alex Williams, Adam Simrell and tops was Reed Pennington, The CAL Champion in pole Vault! At Delcos we won three medals by: Alex Williams and our 2 County Champions: Adam Simrell was tops in Discus and Reed Pennington first in pole vault at 13 feet! We qualified for our record of six events at Districts, as seven Tigers: Simrell, Williams, Pennington, Luke Moyer (in three events), & Luke joined in the 4x1 with Dean Andreadis, Ryan Wise and Garrett Dhunjisha for the highlight of the year as they set a new MNHS School record at 43.89!

**Girls Track and field:**

This outdoor track season the girl's had a great deal of success! We set 3 new records in Long Jump, 200 meter dash and 4x200!!! We had 109 girls compete during the course of the season with countless season and career bests. We narrowly missed district qualifying in the 4x100 and narrowly missed the school record in the 4x400 at Penn Relays. There were numerous medals one from numerous meets this season.

We had Justine Rimple qualify for District Championships in the 100 (just missed the record), 200 (new school record), 400 (just missed the school record), Long Jump (new school record), and High Jump (tied her school record). The 4x200 record team was Jaylen Tyler, Jewel Byju, Brynn Binder and Justine Rimple. Justine Rimple was named to the 2<sup>nd</sup> team All Delco and 1<sup>st</sup> team All Central League in long jump and 2<sup>nd</sup> team All Central League in High jump. Justine took home a silver medal in high jump at Delcos, won the Central League long jump, took silver in the open 200 at Central Leagues and took home a 6<sup>th</sup> place medal in long jump at District Champs (narrowly missing states). Justine is the first district medaler for the girls since at least 1997 and after some more research, might be since the 1980s.

**Boys Lacrosse:**

After graduating 16 seniors last year, the team this year has battled through the toughest regular season schedule we have had since this staff has been on board. We added top competition such as Springside chestnut hill and Cardinal Gibbons out of North Carolina. Our boys just won the district Title, the second of such in a row and 3rd in the last 4 years and we are sitting at the 1 seed in the states. Currently, we are in the quarterfinals of the state playoffs.

### **Girls Lacrosse:**

The Varsity Girls lacrosse team went 13-5 in the 2025 season. Despite the hesitation of moving up to 3A the Girls took it as a challenge and put our name out there early on. Starting out the season strong defeating Garnet Valley for the first time in over 12 years. The girls went on later that week to take down Ridley. With a tougher end of the schedule taking on and falling short to Radnor, Penncrest, Stoga, and WC Henderson, and taking #1 Springfield into overtime.

Going into postseason we took down Springford 18-8, which led us matching up with Springfield again in the second round. With a hard-fought battle of going into double OT our season came to an end. The girls overcame these battles and stuck together throughout the entire season and we could not be more proud.
