- Social supporter/guide

Responsibilities

- Make a commitment to mentor a REACH Hart Scholar
- Serve as an advocate, coach and listener to a mentee on personal, school, career and other issues
- Meet with mentee for a minimum of 30 min. per one-on-one session
- Participate in training
- Participate in special group events and activities

Why do we need mentors?

- Mentoring is required by the REACH foundation for each student.
- Students need support setting and achieving goals.
- Mentoring ensures students are supported by not just the school but also community members.

Qualifications

- A sincere desire to be involved with a young person
- Warmth, openness, patience and empathy
- Willingness to listen
- Trustworthiness and discretion
- Ability to see solutions and opportunities
- Flexibility and ability to travel to and from the site of activities
- Pass the required background check

How can someone become a mentor?

What activities can be done with students?

- Meeting with students consistently is ideal. Discussion can center around school, common interests, family and more.
- Interest inventories will be completed by students and mentors to provide ideas to help foster
- ► Activities will be planned often that will support mentors and mentees.

When do mentors meet with scholars?

- Mentors can meet with students during the school day, after or before school, weekends, or whenever fits the mentor's and mentee's schedules.
- ▶ A consistent time and day are ideal but not required.

How often should mentors meet with scholars?

- ▶ Mentors must meet with their mentee a minimum of 8 times a semester.
- ▶ Meetings can be face to face via phone calls, text, video, etc.
- ▶ Group meeting activities will be created to provide support for all mentors/mentees.
