

Butts County School System is Growing

The Butts County School System sees growth in CCRPI.

JACKSON, GA - The Butts County School System grew in 11 out of the 16 areas where growth was calculated and grew more than the state in ALL the areas. According to the state, the growth comparison for Closing the Gaps cannot be calculated because there were no flags for Math last year. The tables below show the three year trend at each school. The last chart will show the single score trend data. (Note: GADOE does not issue a single score, but this will come from the Governor's Office of Student Achievement at a later date.)

SES remains steady in Content Mastery but had an 18.5 percent growth in Progress. The statewide growth in Progress was -.1, so SES outgrew the state in Progress by 19.5 points.

As stated early, these numbers have not been released by GOSA, but the calculations should be correct. The single score at DES is the first time a BCSS school has scored in the 80s since the state removed the "raising the bar" points in 2018. We are not where we want to be but the positive movement will get us there."
