FM (REGULATION)

SCHOOL SPONSORSHIP

School sponsorship of student activities will apply only to curriculum-related groups or clubs sponsored and promoted by the school.

GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOL-SPONSORED ORGANIZATIONS

The following guidelines will apply to all school-sponsored organizations:

1. The sponsor must be a District employee.
2. All financial accounts and files will be kept in the principal's office, in accordance with Board policy.
3. An annual budget, detailing revenue and expenditures, will be filed with the principal.
4. All activities must have prior approval from the principal and will be placed on the activities calendar.
5. Each sponsor must file a report with the principal at the beginning of each school year listing membership and officer requirements for the organization.
6. Any constitution or bylaws, and subsequent amendments, require approval from the principal and Superintendent.

NO PASS, NO PLAY EXEMPTIONS

Purpose and Eligibility

Courses that have been identified as advanced are eligible for exemption, as noted in Section 33.081 of the Texas Education Code and Board Policy FM(LOCAL).

A student may request an exemption from the "no pass, no play" rule for a failing grade in an applicable course.

- The principal shall grant or deny the request in accordance with these administrative regulations (FM Regulation).
- The applicable course list will be reviewed and updated annually by departments of School Leadership and Teaching and Learning.

Timeframe for Applying Exemption

The exemption may be used at the following periods:

- The end of the evaluation period (progress report).
- The end of the grading period (report card).

Limitations and Conditions

A student's request is subject to the following limitations:

- The student may only receive one exemption per course per school year.
- The student must submit the MISD UIL Eligibility Waiver Request to the campus principal after receiving the required signatures.
- The exemption may not be granted if the student has been assigned to DAEP (Disciplinary Alternative Education Program) or expelled during the current school year.
- The MISD UIL Eligibility Waiver Request form shall be returned to the principal prior to the end of the seven-day grace period.
