



MISD UIL Eligibility Waiver Request

Courses that have been identified as advanced are eligible for exemption, as noted in Section 33.081 of the Texas Education Code and Board Policy FM(LOCAL).

A student may request an exemption from the "no pass, no play" rule for a failing grade in an applicable course. The principal shall grant or deny the request in accordance with administrative regulations (FM Regulation). The applicable advanced course list will be reviewed and updated annually by School Leadership and Teaching and Learning.

The exemption may be used at the end of the evaluation period (progress report) or the end of the grading period (report card.)

The student may only receive one exemption per course per school year. The student must submit the MISD UIL Eligibility Waiver Request to the campus principal. The exemption may not be granted if the student has been assigned to DAEP (Disciplinary Alternative Education Program) or expelled during the current school year.
