LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year 1 finished the three little wolves story. They have focussed on handwriting and adjectives. In Maths we completed an assessment for both arithmetic and reasoning. The results will be shared at the parent consultations next week. In History the children enjoyed talking about their special events. They loved sharing the photograph from home with the rest of the class. This phonics sound is shared below.

Ask me: Tell me about one of your special events




Year 2 had fun acting out key words from the story The Last Wolf. They used descriptive adjectives and verbs to create phrases about the setting and then created a group poem. The class have also worked really hard in maths this week, using base 10 to solve subtractions.

Ask me: What was one of the words we acted out from the story?



Year 3 were lucky enough to visit the Eton College Antiquities Museum this week! The children really enjoyed seeing all the artefacts including the Stone Age artefacts. They loved taking part in a variety of activities and worked well in their teams!

Ask me: How did life change throughout the Stone Age?



Year 4 had a road safety talk delivered by the RBWM Road Safety Education Officer, Al Westley, during which they enjoyed participating in discussions and practical activities about how to keep safe on and near the roads. The class have also been enjoying lots of singing practice in preparation for the Eton Light Switch On, and performed excellently. During geography lessons, we have been using globes and atlases to identify the Tropics and the countries of North and South America and in PE children have been further developing their badminton skills.

Ask me: What do you need to remember to cross a road safely?



Reception have been learning about moving machines this week. We have been reading the story 'Car, Car, Truck, Jeep' and have spent time discussing the different moving machines throughout the story. We have spoken about how vehicles need an engine to work and need to be taken to fuel stations. Some children were starting to notice that some cars are electric and need to be plugged in to charge instead of using fuel. We have worked on our fine motor skills by doing some finger painting and spent time learning about Remembrance Day and why it's important.
