Simons Summer Research Program

Interested in being nominated for the Simons Summer Research Program? **Reach out to your assigned counselor via email to be considered for nomination.** Please include any pertinent information/resume to be appropriately considered. Northview can nominate up to two (2) students for the Summer 2026 program. Please read more about the program below.

Program Information: Established in 1984 as an outreach program for local high school students, the Simons Summer Research program now attracts applicants from all across the country to the Stony Brook campus: Simons Fellows are matched with Stony Brook faculty mentors, join a research group or team, and assume responsibility for a project. The Simons Fellows conclude their apprenticeship by producing a written research abstract and a research poster. In addition to learning valuable techniques and experiencing life at a major research university, Simons Fellows attend weekly faculty research talks and participate in special workshops, tours and events. At the closing poster symposium, students are presented with a stipend award.

The Simons Summer Research Program is supported by the Simons Foundation.

***Students apply while they are currently in their junior year of high school (11th grade)- and participate in the program in the summer before senior year.**

Eligibility: Students interested in science who have demonstrated independence, creativity and an aptitude for doing hands-on work are especially encouraged to apply. Applicants must currently be in their **junior year (11th grade) of high school at the time of applying;** must be US citizens and/or permanent residents; and must be at least 16 years of age by the start of the program (no exceptions). **Dates of Program:** June 29 - August 7, 2026
