## What is Title I?

Program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities for students at schools with high percentages of socioeconomically disadvantaged children

Program is intended to help ensure that all students meet state academic standards

---

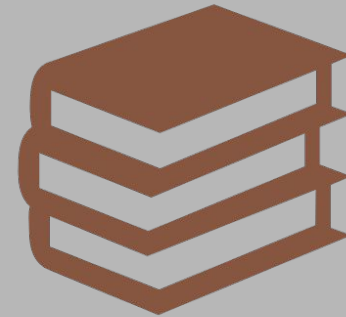


- Schools are allocated Title I funds on the basis of the percentage of students eligible for free/reduced lunch.
- Schools receive Title I funds if forty percent (40%) or more of the student population is eligible for free or reduced lunch.

# Proposed Actions for All Students - Goal 1

- A. Professional Development and Collaboration
  - a. Services in this action are costs for teacher and staff training, any books or supplies related to professional development.
  - b. \$35,225
- B. Improvement of Technology
  - a. Services in this action are costs for technology and software subscriptions
  - b. \$25,087
- C. Targeted Interventions
  - a. Services in this action are costs for salary and benefits for classified or certificated staff to provide extended learning. It also covers AVID Site Coach stipend and Intervention Coach with Data
  - b. \$28,625

TOTAL for this Goal: \$88,937

# Proposed Actions for All Students - Goal 2

- A. Professional Development and Collaboration
  - a. Services in this action are costs for teacher and staff training, any books or supplies related to professional development.
  - b. Funding for this is under Goal 1
- B. Targeted Interventions
  - a. Services in this action are costs for salary and benefits for classified or certificated staff to provide extended learning. It also covers AVID Site Coach stipend and Intervention Coach with Data
  - b. Funding for this is Under Goal 1
- C. Supplemental Resources
  - a. Services in this action includes cost of student planners, digital and physical classroom materials, and curricular to support interventions and interventions. It also includes costs for registration for student academic competitions.
  - b. \$15,300
- D. English Language Development Program services
  - a. Services in this section is to increase ELL student success
  - b. No Cost- part of what is done within current school structures
- E. Involvement of staff, parents and community
  - a. Services include Classified salaries to provide translation at parent events
  - b. \$2000

TOTAL for this Goal: **\$27,300**

# Proposed Actions for All Students - Goal 3

- A. Professional Development and Collaboration
  - a. Services in this action are costs for teacher and staff training, any books or supplies related to professional development and adds books and supplies to support positive social emotional systems on campus.
  - b. \$4000
- B. Social Emotional Supports
  - a. Services in this action include assemblies to increase student achievement, attendance and positive student engagement. It includes awards, PBIS supplies and support for behavioral intervention after school and Saturday to improve behavior with salaries and benefits.
  - b. \$19,580
- C. Parent Engagement
  - a. Services in this action includes cost of books and supplies that may be needed to maintain parental involvement in engagement nights, events or activities. It also includes salaries and benefits for certificated and classified to lead parent nights.
  - b. \$5,600

TOTAL for this Goal: **\$29,180**

# Proposed Actions for All Students - Goal 4

- A. Parent Engagement
  - a. Services in this action are costs for trainings for parents to build leadership opportunities on campus. Costs also include any materials or supplies in order to support and extend learning in trainings.
  - b. \$5,500
