

# RISING 9TH GRADE NEW TO THE PROGRAM OF STUDIES

## PERSONAL FINANCE



As of 2026-27, all students graduating in 2030 or later must complete a 0.5 credit course in personal financial literacy.

This course is open to students in grades 10-12.

## SCIENCE CREDITS



STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO TAKE 3 SCIENCE CREDITS:  
1 CREDIT IN EACH OF THE 3 SCIENCE DOMAINS.

GRADE 9 SCIENCE HAS BEEN UPDATED TO THE TITLE OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE.

## NAVIGATE 9



ALL 9TH GRADERS WILL TAKE NAVIGATE 9 TO PROVIDE SKILLS EMPHASIZING CRITICAL THINKING, RESPECTFUL COMMUNICATION, AND DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP, WITH A FOCUS ON THE ETHICAL USE OF TECHNOLOGY.

# SCIENCE CHANGES

## Graduation Requirements

Science Credit 1

**Environmental Science**  
(Grade 9 course)

Science Credit 2

**Life Science**  
(any Biology course)

Science Credit 3

**Physical Science**  
(any Chemistry or Physics course)



## Suggested Science Sequence

### SCIENCE SEQUENCE

These sequences represent typical pathways through high school science classes, but additional pathways are possible. If you have any questions, your current science teacher or school counselor will be able to answer them for you.

Grade 9	Grade 10	Grade 11	Grade 12
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#### Most Rigorous Sequence

Students planning careers in science, medicine, engineering, or environmental studies should follow this sequence, especially if applying to highly competitive colleges, and are encouraged to add science options aligned with their interests.

Honors Environmental Science	Biology (Honors or AP)	Chemistry (Honors or AP) and/or Physics (Honors or AP)
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#### Honors and Academic Sequence

College and non-college bound students seeking a complete study of high school science are encouraged to follow this sequence. Students planning a career in the sciences should consider additional science options that match their interests.

Environmental Science (Honors or Academic)	Biology (Honors, Academic, or Practical)	Chemistry (Honors, Academic, or Conceptual) and/or Physics (Honors or Academic)
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### Important Changes:

- Graduation Requirements:
  - Continue to require 3 Science Credits in high school
  - Students will take 1 credit in each of the 3 Science domains.
  - This approach was designed to ensure maximum coverage of the STEELS standards in high school.
- Grade 9 Science has been updated to support a block schedule and will now be called Environmental Science.

# BLOCK SCHEDULING IN GRADES 9-12

## THE BENEFITS TO STUDENTS



### Organization of the School Day.

Block schedules are similar to a college course schedule: Most classes are 1 semester.



\* Students can take four courses per marking period

\*83 minutes each block



\* Allows for “doubling up” in a subject area. Students can take multiple Math, Science and World Language classes in one year.

- 1. SOCIOLOGY (NO PREQ)
- 2. ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY (NO PREQ)
- COURSE ARE TAKEN AT CB EAST DURING THE SCHOOL DAY AND TAUGHT BY CB EAST FACULTY. THE DECISION TO POTENTIALLY EARN COLLEGE CREDIT WILL BE MADE DURING THE FIRST WEEK OF EACH SEMESTER. STUDENTS TAKING THESE DELAWARE VALLEY UNIVERSITY DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES WILL PAY \$100 PER CREDIT, WHICH WILL BE BILLED DIRECTLY BY THE UNIVERSITY. FINAL COST WILL BE \$300. (CAL 1 WILL BE \$400)


