

LEARNER PROFILE

Laguna Beach High School (LBHS), established in 1934, enrolls 820 students and is the only high school in the Laguna Beach Unified School District—the smallest public high school in Orange County. Recognized as a California Gold Ribbon and Distinguished School, LBHS earned a six-year WASC accreditation in 2025. Alongside its strong college-prep program, LBHS promotes its Learner Profile, which builds teamwork, problem-solving, communication, resiliency, creativity, and empathy—skills essential for academic, professional, and community success.



GRADING & CLASS RANK

The school year is divided into two semesters. Students receive letter grades each semester and two progress reports during the course of each semester. The Academic Grade Point Average (GPA) and class rank are based on all grades with the exception of physical education and athletics. Advanced Placement and some honors courses receive an extra point in calculating the GPA.


