Call to order: Meeting called to order by Bezio at 5:31 p.m.

Approval of Agenda: Prescott made a motion to accept the agenda, seconded by Webster. The motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Krista Huling lives in Cambridge and with last week's immigration raid, she is wondering if there are policies in place to keep children and schools safe. She recommends looking at the policy that Winooski uses. Julie Kurtain also lives in Cambridge. She shares the same concerns.

LNSU/LNMMUUSD Routine Business:

Consent Agenda Items – Minutes of the October 13, 2025, LNSU/LNMMUUSD Board Meeting and FCC, Curriculum and Social-Emotional Wellness & Safety Committee meetings; Personnel Committee Meeting on October 28, 2025 – Hunsberger made a motion to accept the minutes, seconded by Stebbins. The motion passed unanimously.

Board Orders – Sweet reviewed the board orders and recommends that the board approve. Hunsberger made the motion to approve the board orders, seconded by Prescott. The motion passed unanimously.

Sale of Second Servings, School Nutrition Program – Discussion & Possible Action- Clark stated the director of the district's nutrition program would like to try out selling second servings at the secondary level. The pricing will stay within the school nutrition guidelines.

Request to Release GMTCC Capital Reserve Funds to Purchase Vape Detectors – Discussion & Possible Action - Remmers stated that the high school has installed vape detectors and they are successful. Currently there is only one in the tech center. Remmers would like to purchase one more. There was a grant that the high school used, but that is not available to the tech center. Remmers is requesting to use money from the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of the additional vape detector. Hunsberger made the motion to approve the use of Capital Reserve Funds to purchase a vape detector for the tech center, seconded by Stebbins. The motion passed unanimously.

Budget Process Update – Clark shared the FCC has done their first preliminary meeting with the secondary level. Next week, FCC is meeting with the elementary schools. This afternoon, Clark did get some information from the State regarding Special Education that she has not reviewed yet.

Preview of Community Event – Possible Discussion – Gallagher is opening the community event with the recent survey. There were 350 responses, the most ever submitted. One of the top priorities is regarding safety.
