ADVANCED COURSES

Rowland Hall has offered 19 AP courses, 7 Advanced Topics (AT), and 5 Advanced Research (AR) courses for the class of 2026. Students who take an AP course are required to take the corresponding AP exam. Our AT courses were designed by our faculty and are as rigorous as AP courses, focusing on inquiry-based learning. AT courses provide the opportunity to tackle real-world problems, dig deeper into topics of interest to students and teachers, and provide more hands-on practice, like frequent lab work, field studies, and trips, as well as collaboration between departments. Advanced Research (AR) courses are designed to engage students beyond the AP/AT curriculum with an opportunity to learn college-level research skills in a particular discipline, develop an original thesis, and conduct research under the guidance of an expert in a particular field. Some AR courses offer the opportunity to present at a conference, publish original work, and/or work with a university professor.

ACADEMIC POLICIES

- In August 2025, Rowland Hall moved to a full AP/AR curriculum and no longer offers AT courses.
- In 2023 - 2024, trimesters were eliminated. All courses are on a semester or year-long schedule.
- Rowland Hall does not calculate class rank.
- Academic work completed at other institutions will not appear here, nor be included in cumulative GPA with the exception of courses taken through One Schoolhouse, an online Rowland Hall partner. These are designated "OS: course title," which are included in our GPA calculation and, if they are AP courses, the GPA calculation is weighted.
- Advanced Research (AR) Courses: AR Chemistry, AR Biology, AR Physics, AR Computational Science, and AR Humanities are the only courses that have AP/AT prerequisites, making them the most rigorous courses in their disciplines.
- AP courses, AT (Advanced Topics), and AR courses are weighted & add one extra point per class to the GPA.
- In 2025 - 2026, Rowland Hall removed Personal Fitness, Physical Education, Athletic Teams, and Rowmark from the transcript. These are all non-GPA bearing activities.
- In 2022 - 2023, Rowland Hall removed the 4 core course limit for Rowmark student-athletes.

CURRICULUM HIGHLIGHTS

Advanced Research (AR)

- Rowland Hall is dedicated to further expanding research opportunities through AR experiences, opening the door for more students to build a strong foundation for research, critical-reading skills, and a sound understanding of scientific writing.
- AR classes emulate the methods, practices and scholarship students will be immersed in when they go to college.
- In April 2025, our AR Biology students presented their research work at the American Association for Cancer Research Annual Meeting in Chicago. They also wrote up their work as review articles over the summer, in collaboration with researchers at City of Hope, CA. Those articles are being packaged for submission to different journals, including the journal "Biomedicines" for peer review.
- Admission to any course with an advanced designation or to AP, AT, and AR courses is made on the basis of departmental and/or teacher recommendation and an assessment of the student's overall course load. Some classes may require prerequisite coursework, a minimum grade threshold, and/or a placement exam.
