1987— The Beginning of an Ending

1987 marks a monumental ending at WFHS, while being a long-awaited beginning at the same time. The Class of 1987 will have the unique honor of being the last class to graduate from WFHS as we now know it. WFHS was built in 1939 as a result of the Work Projects Administration, and graduated its first class in 1942. Since that beginning there have been many changes in both structure and space. The original WFHS consisted of only 2 floors, with what is now the main entrance being the southernmost door in 1939. A partial third floor, gymnasium, music room, and auditorium were added later, contributing to the WFHS as we know it today, a building that has served West Fargo and surrounding communities for nearly 50 years.

A FIT MIND & BODY



The wins didn't add up to many, but the team's memories will last forever.







Alive and Kicking in '86.







Girls' Swimming—a Real Splash




Packers pin to win



Next year will see several seniors gone, which is unfortunate since they are the strength of the team. However, there are several able wrestlers returning, so there is always hope.



And this hard work has paid off. At the drill team competition, the Packatahnahs did very well.





It is important for the choirs that audiences also understand and nourish the special musical gifts of each performance.

Mr. Loy and Mrs. Morrison are firmly convinced of the importance and practicality of the belief that choral music must have worth and dignity with unlimited artistic stimulation and challenge. People respond to something that is good and there is a great appeal in the opportunity for self-growth. Trying hard for refinement is a humane thing.






Not afraid to speak up


