





USA FOR AFRICA — 45 American recording artists joined together to record "We Are The World" and raise millions for hunger relief in Africa. Later in the year, the two-continents Live Aid concert raised more than \$70 million.

LIBERTY — After nearly two years, restoration of the Statue of Liberty was completed. Rededication was scheduled for July, 1986.

REFRIGERATOR — 300 lb rookie William "The Refrigerator" Perry helped lead the Chicago Bears to a Super Bowl win.

T.V. FASHION — "Miami Vice" was tops in T.V. and in fashion trend-setting. Stars Don Johnson and Philip Michael Thomas popularized casual but dressy styles in pastel colors.

JET CRASH — A Japan Air Lines plane crashed into a remote mountainside, killing a record 520 people. 1985 was the worst year in history for air fatalities.

SUMMIT — President Reagan met with Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev in Geneva, Switzerland.

MUD SLIDE — The Red Cross joined the rescue effort in Colombia after Nevado del Ruiz volcano erupted, causing a mud slide that killed 20,000.

WORLD SERIES — Bret Saberhagen led the Kansas City Royals to victory in the World Series. Saberhagen pitched a five-hitter and was named MVP for the Series.

ANNIVERSARY — Ceremonies at the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, D.C., and a veteran march in New York City commemorated the 10-year anniversary of U.S. withdrawal from Vietnam.

CHALLENGER — The space shuttle Challenger exploded minutes after launch Jan. 28, 1986. All seven crew members died, including teacher Christa McAuliffe, chosen to be the first civilian in space.

REAGAN — President Reagan, with his wife Nancy, gave the A-okay sign from his hospital window after undergoing surgery to remove a cancerous tumor.

FAREWELL — Several great stars of stage and screen died during 1985, among them Orson Welles, 70; Rock Hudson, 69; and Yul Brynner, 65.



Tony England

West Fargo, once looked upon as a rough community, has many reasons to hold its head high. "Only a few cities can boast that one of their students is an astronaut," said principal of WFHS, Michael Drew. Giving their now famous Packer cheer, the WFHS student body enthusiastically welcomed alumnus, Astronaut Tony England. The assembly program was held September 20, honoring the 1959 graduate who flew on the Space Shuttle Challenger in July, 1985.

"It feels like the football team just came back from winning the EDC Championship," joked England. "It's really good to be back home," he added. During the assembly, England's family and wife, Cathy, were recognized. Student Council President, Darin Millar, accepted a West Fargo flag with the school's coat of arms, which England flew during his mission. In return, England was presented with a letterman's jacket, complete with his shuttle flight number on the chest. England narrated a slide and film which showed the Challenger's flight program. England claims he first became interested in becoming an astronaut when he was in the ninth grade. "That Halloween, some friends and I saw what we thought to be a UFO. We never told anyone about it," said England. "Who was going to believe a bunch of ninth graders on Halloween," he added laughing. According to England, he was influenced by his uncle who is a pilot and because of his love of science while attending WFHS.

England graduated from West Fargo High in three years. He then went to MIT where he received his bachelor degree in physiology, a master in geology, and a doctorate in geophysics. England attended fifty-three weeks of Air Force Flight School for the Apollo mission. In 1967, England went to NASA. He supported Apollo flights 13 and 16. When they went to the moon, "I was one of the guys the astronauts on those flights talked to," said England.

How did someone from West Fargo get picked to be an astronaut on an actual flight? "Seniority," says England, "background has a lot to do with it also," he added.

One thing England stressed was that if anyone is interested in math and science, they should go into a field that deals with those subjects. "Not many actually make it into space," commented England.

Along with six other crew members, Eng-

land explained that although the films he showed seemed to portray the astronauts mission was all play and no work, it was slightly the opposite. "In fact, we worked in two twelve hour shifts. Our meals and house cleaning chores weren't included in that time span," he added.

In fact, England claims he didn't have a chance to look out the window until the fourth day. "I tied myself off under a blanket at a window, and for two or three hours I watched the Earth go by. When you're that close to the stars, they look red, blue, green, and many other colors."

"We had a lot of troubles sleeping after staying up fourteen hours," commented England. "We took sleeping pills to help us sleep soundly and by that time it was too late to take another. As a result, we were very tired by the end of the mission," admitted England.

Although there was a lot of responsibility to pull the mission off successfully, "People worked for years on this mission," he said. "In fact we knew about the mission four years before the actual flight," England added. As expected the mission did have its share of problems. The first scheduled flight was aborted when they lost an engine before lift off. "It was a very quiet period following the aborted flight, everyone held their breath because there was 3½ million pounds of explosives beneath us," said England, "but everyone was very professional and we were off the shuttle within 40 minutes," he added. There were also problems with the restroom facilities, and one of the telescopes wandered from the shuttle. "Everything was fixed for two or three days by the end of the mission," he said.

Through the bad there was good. More than a dozen history making experiments were performed during the flight period. "The experiments we did dealt with studying the suns different spectral regions, we x-rayed sources in the galactic center, we grew plants and also performed experiments on crystals to name a few," said England. Although the astronauts were without all the comforts of home, they had a few. One of which was highly commercialized. Was it Pepsi or Coke the astronauts drank? "We had four cans of each, none of us tried both," England, who tried Coke, said the reason for the tests was to evaluate carbonated beverages. "The technology of the container worked well," he said. "I think it's limited because when you're up in space you

have enough gas already," he added.

"The food was almost earth like," claims England, who expressed a great liking for the shrimp cocktail. "The food containers are very similar to that used for backpacking," he commented.

"The mission was very tiring," claims England. But, the work didn't end there. From there the astronauts went through a long and tiring debriefing which helped make official records and to discuss the details of the trip, what improvements are needed, and how well the systems worked.

Though England claims he's used to the publicity because of the Apollo, "I think I need to share my experience, it's important because the people are paying for it," he said.

England now keeps others informed by use of his two way amateur radio experience. "It's a way to communicate, I do it with the intent to share as much as possible." England currently has approximately 130 contacts with young amateur radio groups.

Said England of the mission, "It's easy to say it's fun, but it's also satisfying. I feel useful helping to develop these missions, it's fulfilling. It's a rare case to have the chance to build it (technology used) and then to be able to use it," he added. "It was all worth it."

A lot may have been accomplished, according to England, "We're just starting, we have a long ways to go yet," he said. "There's not a question if we will leave this planet, the question is when." In fact England estimated that though Antarctica is not on another planet, within ten years there may be a space research station located there because of people's inability to live there for long periods of time. Antarctica is the closest thing to space we've got here on Earth. England's visit was last September 20-23. Events honoring England included discussion with several school groups, a picnic, a banquet, the Chamber of Commerce awarded him with a green blazer, fireworks display, street dance, tug of war competitions, a salute at the VFW parking lot where, presented by Mayor Clayton Loedon, England was the first recipient of a key to the city of West Fargo.





GIRLS SWIMMING



The West Fargo boys' and girls' cross country team finished third and second, respectively, at the EDC regional meet. Their win at regionals gave both the boys' and girls' teams a tie for second with Fargo South in the overall EDC standings.

Both teams finished the regular dual season tied for first with Fargo South. That, according to Zimney, was something of a surprise. "We didn't expect to end up first in duals."

The team finished the EDC season right about where Zimney expected them to. "We thought we could be at least second," commented Zimney, "We knew first would be hard."

Top ten finishers for the Pack at EDC regionals were Brian Gullickson 1st and Jeff Henning 10th. Girls' top ten finishers were Kelly McDonald 4th, Kim Jenner 6th, Marni Zimney 8th, and Dixie Klein 10th. "We wanted first or second at regional," said Zimney. Before state competition the boys were rated fourth in the state behind Dickenson, Fargo South, and Williston. The previous best finish for the boys at state was sixth. "Hopefully we can do better than that," said Zimney. "If everyone runs a good race we could place in the top four," said co-captain Brian Gullickson.

The goal for the girls' team was to do better than their fifth place finishes. Going into the state meet ranked fifth, Zimney expected top-rated Minot, Bismarck, Mandan, and Fargo South to be tough. Individually, Zimney expected Kelly McDonald and Kim Jenner to finish in the top ten. Jenner was optimistic about her chances, hoping only to be in the top fifteen.

According to Zimney, Brian Gullickson, Jeff Henning, Jim Lahren, Don Collins, Chad Aune, and Eric Wymer all had excellent chances for top twenty finishes in the boys division. Gullickson went into the state meet undefeated in both North Dakota and Minnesota. "I've had a great season," remarked Gullickson. "I couldn't ask for more." Both Gullickson and Zimney felt he had a good shot at the state title, even though he faced the only other undefeated runner in North Dakota, Rob Heen of Williston. That was added incentive for Gullickson. With a top eight finish he qualified for the AAU Junior Olympics on December twelfth.

The team consisted of co-captains Brian Gullickson, and Jeff Henning, as well as Jim Lahren, Barret DeFay, Don Collins, Chad Aune, Kirk Odden, Eric Wymer, Jay Orson, and Kevin Odden. 




ART CLUB




THE PACKER STAFF
