We the West Fargo Annual Staff of 1982 would like to dedicate this annual to Mr. Ward Galbreath for his years of service.

Mr. Galbreath graduated from Enderlin, N.D. in 1948. After graduation Mr. Galbreath attended both NDSU and Concordia, receiving a degree in social studies. In 1955, Mr. Galbreath received his first teaching job. He was hired as a social studies teacher here at West Fargo High School; the same position he now holds.



When Mr. Galbreath started teaching in 1955 many things were different. He was the only history teacher of the 14 who made up the faculty at WFHS. This compares to the 7 history and 60 total teachers that we now have. The senior count of 1956 was 27 compared to the 210 of 1982. Mr. Galbreath became the yearbook advisor in 1956. Since then many things have had to change to include new clubs, organizations, and sports. For example, Mr. Galbreath's first annual had 60 pages, we have 136. We have 8 color pages, they had none. The first yearbook cost \$3.50, ours cost \$11.00. Once again we the annual staff of WFHS would like to thank Mr. Galbreath for his service.


The Woman Is Required to Pay






HOMECOMING 1981








Guard tower at Dachau Prison near Munich, Germany.
