

I spent this past summer as WFHS summer exchange student. I arrived June 24, on Terceira, one of the nine Azorean Islands owned by Portugal. Although a beautiful country, my island was quite poor. Many of the buildings are demolished due to the earthquake of 1980. There are many fruit trees on Terceira. The Atlantic ocean can be seen from almost everywhere on the island. The people were very friendly and even though there is an American Air Force base on the island the Portugese people were still interested in learning about me. Many thought North Dakota was near California and asked if I knew any of their relatives.

My Portugese father is the head electrician on the base and also has his own business repairing washing machines and stoves. He also raises pigs and does alot of bidding on items he resells. My mother stayed home and took care of the house and three children, Diana 9, Tiago 4, and Fabio 2.

I spent alot of time watching bullfights held in the street and going to parades and festivals. I rode in the Bode-de-lout (Festival of Milk) in which I wore the traditional dress of the women. I spend some the time at the beach and alot of the time shopping and touring Terceira. I left on August 24, after what seemed to be a fast two months. Hopefully I will be able to return to my friends and family within the next two years.







\*Boys Cross Country team places 4th at EDC and 9th at State.


\*Brian Gullickson places 4th at State Meet. Highest individual finish for WF boys team at a State Meet.

## What An Unbelievable Year!



Yes, Danny Williams, the Packers were #1 in 1984. As the picture shows you and Brian Dickman celebrating the victory over Fargo North, it also shows a great deal more for the "Pack in '84." For the first time in W.F.H.S. history, West Fargo defeated all three Fargo schools in football in the same season. We had the best record in the history of the school since going Class "A". We got to the state semi-finals losing to eventual state champion Bismarck 19-12, in what many people called the state championship game, but there is more . . . Before we detail the season, let us detail some individuals: Shane Thompson — wow, what a season! He set 11 of 12 all-time offensive records, in addition, All-EDC First Team. Yes, "Flash" had quite a year! But he wasn't the only one; Todd Zabel set 6 all-time records for the Pack. But that doesn't tell the whole story, either. The selection of Thompson and Zabel to the First Team Eastern Dakota Conference — All Conference Team would not have been possible had three other West Fargo Packers made the same team: Scott Becher, Scott Sinner, and Kevin Breitling, all three offensive linemen. It was these people who opened holes in the line for Zabel to run through and kept people away from Thompson so he could throw. Let us not forget "the others." For you see football is a team game and those teams that are most successful are those in which no one cares who gets the credit, just the win. It takes many parts to make a whole. Somebody has to catch those passes, Mapes, Matthys, and Dickman more often than not were on the receiving end. Faircloth, Lykken, Sinner, or Becher convoyed Zabel, Zeadow, or Monte to daylight on more than one occasion. This is a team. TEAMS win football games, undisputed conference champions, have four shut-outs in the course of a season, and outscored

their opponents 264 to 124; all this enroute to a 7-3 season that was filled with exciting moments, heart-break, anger, sweat, and most of all, success. Who will forget the thrill of overtime against South and Zabel's catch in the end zone for a 14-7 win; the next week's defeat of Shanley, a team never beaten by the Packers, or better yet, the only conference loss of the season against Red River at Homecoming? Can one game contain so much despair and joy? Falling behind 21-0 by the end of the first quarter and a tie ballgame at half time; only to lose in overtime. This game was not for the weak of heart. But a loss is a loss and now it was necessary to reapply the knowledge and skill needed to complete a successful season. The victory at Jamestown, 27-0, provided that. It set the stage for the most important contest of the season — NORTH: Around this game, drama's were to be played out: state rankings, a sweep of the Fargo schools, and, of course, the playoffs. What it came down to was BEAT NORTH for the pure joy, the unlimited exaltation, the absolute thrill of beating a rival that loves to beat you. The outcome of the game: 34-13. North falls by the wayside, not really a worthy opponent on that night; but who would have known at gametime that Jimmy Johnson, a replacement, or Williams filling in for an injured Mapes, would become pass catchers extra-ordinary, or that Thompson would have one of his best nights of the season, keeping a shaky North pass defense off-balance all night; that the defense would play one of the best games of the season; David Olson and Stacy Schweitzer emerging as defensive leaders; Zabel playing pass defense like someone possessed covering North's number one receiver like a blanket. And others, for that is the nature of a team. Rick Sprecher, Cooper Thurston, Jud De-



Loss, and all the rest that rose to the occasion. For to be a champion you must rise above yourself, to play inspired. On this night the Packers did. There were other victories in this championship season: 44-0 over Wahpeton and 28-0 defeat of Bismarck St. Mary in the playoffs, and of course, the defeat by Bismarck Central. Wins and losses are the record of a team. In the long reach of time, they will not be forgotten, blurred by memories grown weak with the ravages of time. However, what will not be forgotten are the laughs, the good times, the fellowship, the sense of being so alive when we won and so empty when we lost. We shall not forget "This Championship Season of 1984." Thanks Coach Monte, Coaches Saum, Cwikla, and Willis. No one but us know how hard you worked. They don't really care, but we do. This season was just as much yours as it was ours.

## Girls Swim Finishes Best Season.


What's better than 4th place? Third of course! and that's exactly how the W.F. Girl's Swim Team ended the year off at EDC

## Packer Swimmers Grasp 4th Place At EDC




But in place of the old, there was new; new players, new challenges, a new season. Let us then put to rest the old and begin the new.





## Student Body Participates In Intramurals






## Christel Rousset Tells Of Her Stay In The U.S.A.



## Packer Golf




