- Students must earn one or more of the College and Career Readiness Indicators established by the ALSDE as a requirement for graduation.

## CAREER PREPAREDNESS

Career Preparedness Course Credit 1.0 (All content standards are required) OR as two sequential one-half credit courses, divided as follows: 0.5 Career Preparedness A (Standards 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 17, and 18 are required) AND 0.5 Career Preparedness B (Standards 4, 5, 7, 13, 14, 15, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, and 24 are required) Grade Levels 9-12. Prerequisites Career Preparedness A is the prerequisite to Career Preparedness B Career Preparedness focuses on three integrated areas of instruction: academic planning and career development, financial literacy, and technology. Course content includes college and career preparation, computer literacy skills, and personal finance.

Technology topics are interwoven throughout course instruction. These standards are designed to provide a strong foundation for student acquisition of the skills, attitudes, and knowledge that enable them to achieve success in school, at work, and across the life span.

Other topics addressed in Career Preparedness are business and industry, continuing education, and lifelong learning. Partnerships and alliances between educational institutions, governmental entities and employers can support these standards and connect students to potential career opportunities.

Through these standards, students learn and apply safety concepts, explore career opportunities and requirements, practice the skills needed to succeed in the workplace, develop leadership qualities and take advantage of the opportunities afforded by Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSOs), learn and practice essential digital literacy skills, and participate in one or more of the four facets of Work-Based Learning (awareness, exploration, participation, and training). The foundational standards are to be incorporated throughout the course.

## Dual Enrollment

### DUAL ENROLLMENT/DUAL CREDIT

Dual Enrollment for Dual Credit is an enrichment opportunity allowing eligible high school students to earn high school and college credits for courses taken through an Alabama Community College System (ACCS) institution while still enrolled in high school. Dual Enrollment for Dual Credit is available to students attending public, private, parochial, or church/religious schools pursuant to § 16- 28-1 of the Code of Alabama 1975, or who are receiving instruction from a homeschool/private tutor pursuant to § 16-28-5 of the Code of Alabama 1975.

Students must meet the following requirement to be eligible to participate in Dual Credit:

1. Responsible for all college tuition and fee costs as required by the postsecondary institution.
2. Have and maintain a "2.5" overall GPA and meet the admission requirements of the participating postsecondary institution. Please note: some programs may require a higher GPA.
3. Successfully completed ninth grade.
4. Tenth graders will only be allowed to take US History or Spanish.
5. Students on the advanced math track may take dual enrollment AFTER completing Algebra II.
6. Select courses that are approved by AHS and agreed upon as a course substitution (see list below).
7. Approval from the School Counselor and Administrator

## Promotion and Retention

### High School

Students in 9th-12th grades must score a minimum average of 60/D or higher in class to receive credit towards high school graduation requirements.
