Preschool and prekindergarten

Support your child's first school experience with a curriculum aligned to district kindergarten standards. Licensed teachers create inclusive classrooms and partner with families on learning goals. Choose flexible morning or afternoon classes, two to five days per week, at multiple locations. Tuition is based on family income and scholarships are available.

- **Preschool** is for children who turned 3 years old by Sept. 1, 2025 and is offered at three locations.
- **Prekindergarten** is for children who turned 4 years old by Sept. 1, 2025 and is offered at seven locations in the district with free transportation to eligible students.

Four Star Express

A full-day, school-based child care and early learning program for children who turned 4 years old by Sept. 1, 2025. This tuition-based program is offered Monday through Friday, 7 a.m.-5:30 p.m., and follows the school year calendar. Scholarships and child care assistance are available. Daily breakfast, lunch and snacks are included along with free transportation to eligible students.

Blast Wrap Around Care

A school-based child care program that supports student attending prekindergarten programs at Oak View Elementary School.

- Care is available Monday through Friday, 7 a.m.-5:30 p.m. on school days and most non-school days.
- Weekly tuition is required. Scholarships or child care assistance are available.
- Registration is first come, first served.

If this program becomes available at more elementary schools, communication will be shared with families in the community.

Free Half-Day, Every Day prekindergarten

A morning or afternoon prekindergarten program for children who turned 4 years old by Sept. 1, 2025 at seven locations in the district with free transportation to eligible students. Apply and then enroll at Osseo Area Schools' Enrollment Center.



TARGETED SERVICES

Targeted Services classes in Osseo Area Schools offer engaging, enrichment-based learning opportunities before and after school for qualifying students in kindergarten through eighth grade. Programs are available at many sites across the district. Classes include a wide variety of topics, such as arts and crafts, cooking, gardening, STEM, music, movement and support in literacy and math.

Each site offers programs based on student interests and staff strengths, led by dedicated educators who bring passion and creativity to their work.

These hands-on classes help deepen learning, build confidence, foster curiosity and support academic readiness. With high-quality, site-specific offerings and caring educators, students can discover new skills, grow socially and emotionally and explore their creativity in a supportive environment.



Program highlight

North View Middle School has kicked off its popular after school activities program, which takes place three afternoons a week and offers a variety of fun, engaging activities that students can engage in alongside their school peers. School counselor and Targeted Services Coordinator Shanna Schroeder said this popular program has 303 participating students this year, which represents over half the school's students. Nearly 100 of these students opted to sign up for multiple activities.

Many of the after-school activity options run through the school's Targeted Services program, such as cooking, volleyball, jazz band, public art, dance technique and board games and puzzles.

New this year, Three Rivers Park District is teaming up with the school to offer an Explorers Club, where students go on field trips and do outdoor activities like fishing, fire building and archery.

There are also some more counseling-focused options like Improve your Tomorrow mentoring program and Minnesota African Women's Association girls group, a club for African girls that focuses on college attendance, financial literacy, self-esteem building and more.

"Our Targeted Services Programming is all about helping students feel connected, supported, and inspired to learn," said Schroeder. "Through engaging activities, strong relationships with caring adults, and unique enrichment opportunities, we're creating a space where students can explore their interests beyond the traditional school day."

Making an impact



"I choose to support Targeted Services because I've seen firsthand the incredible impact it has on our students and staff. The program allows us to connect in a more personal and meaningful way beyond the regular classroom, I like to call it "sneak teaching." For example, through groups like Creative Cooking, students can practice math skills while preparing their favorite dishes and building new friendships along the way. Through Targeted Services, students who may not always feel seen or included, such as those in the LGBTQ+ community, students receiving special education support, or anyone still finding their place, are given space to belong, build confidence and thrive. As a facilitator, my goal is always to create an environment where every student feels at home and comfortable showing up as their authentic self. Watching them grow, connect and succeed reminds me why this work matters so deeply."

DREAM

In Osseo Area Schools' Community Education, students, staff and community members are encouraged to dream big, envision their future, identify their passions and believe in their potential.



Community Education's Adult Enrichment students have been busy at the potter's wheel at Maple Grove High School this fall in one of the program's most popular evening classes, 'Exploring Pottery.'

Participants are learning to center clay, pull walls and practice hand-building techniques. Their creations take shape as mugs, bowls and other unique pieces before they add personal style through glazing and firing.

The class offers more than instruction. Over six sessions, students not only practice and create art with clay but also connect with others who share an interest in art and pottery.

Osseo Area Schools' Community Education offers Adult Enrichment classes year-round, both in person and online. Adults can choose from courses in art, cooking, dance, health, technology and more. These opportunities encourage lifelong learning and provide accessible ways to try new things, get inspired and engage with the community.



In the spring of 2025, Garden City Elementary School fourth grade students and teacher Bridget Lee led a school-wide gardening project, constructing sub-irrigated planters with support from a District 279 Foundation grant.

"They took ownership from day one," said Lee. "They researched materials, costs, and even practiced public speaking to present their plan to the principal. It was entirely student driven."

The fourth graders developed build plans, measured wood, calculated materials and physically constructed the beds. Each grade level selected the fruits and vegetables they wanted to grow, researched spacing and sunlight needs to plan their gardens.

"My favorite thing was I got to try some fruits and vegetables that I never tried before. The experience was nice," said William, a now fifthgrade student who helped build the planters.

If you visit the Maple Grove Community Gymnasium attached to Maple Grove Middle School on a weeknight, there's a good chance you'll meet Roy Doron. He has been part of Osseo Area Schools' Community Education facilities scheduling team since 1999. After a brief break during the pandemic he returned to continue supporting the community and school district as a building supervisor.

Roy oversees the full-size gyms and sets up basketball hoops, tables, chairs, and meeting spaces for community sports activities or events. He coordinates with permit holders any special requests and prepares the building for daily use.

He emphasizes inclusivity and importance of customer service in everything he does. "You want people to feel welcome. This is their community. If they want to learn or have fun, they should be able to," Roy said.

For Roy, the most rewarding part is the relationships he builds with others. Families return over the years, greeting him with excitement, "Hi Roy!"

"It's not the work you miss—it's the people," said Roy.

"Roy was a staple in Community Education Facilities Scheduling for many years and we are lucky to have him back on staff," said Dana Nelson, facilities scheduling program manager. "His friendly smile and unwavering commitment to excellent customer service for permit holders and event attendees alike have established him as a highly valued building supervisor."



For the past two years, Osseo Area Schools' Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) staff have brought programming to families with young children living in temporary housing.

The effort began when staff learned about families staying in a local shelter with limited space for children to play. Partnering with organizations such as the Hennepin County Library and Helping Us Grow, ECFE created opportunities for families to connect with resources and one another.

In collaboration with the Hennepin County Library, weekly playtime activities now include art projects, sensory play and toy lending. Parent educators provide one-on-one support and help families access essential items such as car seats and winter clothing.

"By showing up each week, offering respect and creating a safe space for children to play and parents to feel seen, we gave them something powerful — a sense of belonging," said Timka Remetic, ECFE community liaison.

The program continues to adapt to family needs. Summer activities included park visits and library trips. This fall, bilingual staff are continuing weekly playtime sessions that engage both children and parents.

Many families choose to stay in the community after leaving the shelter, expressing that they finally feel a sense of belonging.

EXPLORE

In Osseo Area Schools' Community Education, students, staff and community members can explore more about who they are, try new things and engage in the community around them through hands-on learning, robust courses and realworld connections.



Homework Starts with Home is a grant funded program in partnership with Hennepin County and the YMCA. Families with children enrolled in Osseo Area Schools who live in Hennepin county and have fallen behind in rent and have received an eviction notice may be eligible for assistance through this program.

The program started receiving applications for assistance in the spring of 2022.

From June through August 2025, Homework Starts with Home assisted 34 households with rental assistance and case management services.

"Supporting families through Homework Starts with Home is a vital part of ensuring families feel welcome," said Kendra Kuhlmann, housing stability social worker and foster care liaison at the Enrollment Center. "When housing stability is strengthened, students can engage in learning and thrive in school. The partnership with Hennepin County and the YMCA allows the opportunity to walk alongside families to offer support within their unique situations."

In Osseo Area Schools, school age care programs are dedicated to providing an enriching choice-based education in a safe and welcoming environment where children are inspired, personal growth is nurtured and families are supported. Celebrating Lights On Afterschool is one way Community Education programs create opportunities that positively impact our community.

DISCOVER

In Osseo Area Schools' Community Education, students, staff and community members can discover their talents, values and purpose, feeling empowered to make choices and contribute meaningfully to the community.



Osseo Area Schools' Adult Basic Education (ABE) launched specialty classes this fall in response to a growing community need to help adults gain skills to support their personal, academic and career goals. Applications are typically not required for students who are:

- Continuing at their current school or magnet program to next grade level
- Currently enrolled residents in the Osseo Area Schools district boundaries who are entering sixth grade or ninth grade and are following their school's enrollment pathway
