

Why are we here?



- The *Every Student Succeeds ACT of 2015* requires that each Title I School hold an Annual Meeting of Title I parents for the purpose of...
 - Informing you of your school's participation in Title I.
 - Explaining the requirements of Title I.
 - Explaining your rights as parents to be involved.

What does it mean to be a Title I School?



- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for...
 - Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these students meet the State's challenging content standards.
 - Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
 - Conducting parent and family engagement meetings/trainings/activities
- Being a Title I school also means parent and family involvement and knowing their rights under ESSA.

What is the 1% set–aside and how are parents involved?

- Any School District that receives federal money exceeding \$500,000 is required by law to set aside **1%** of Title I allocation for parent and family engagement.
- The Breakdown of funds for schools:
 - The district will keep 10% of all funding for parental involvement/engagement activities and supplies
 - Schools receive 90% (distributed based on student count) to use for school level engagement activities.




What is the LEA Consolidated Plan?



- The LEA Consolidated Plan addresses how the LEA will use Title I funds throughout the school system. Topics include:
 - Student academic assessments (Mock ACT Exams)
 - Coordination and integration of federal funds and programs (Parent Engagement and Instructional Support)
 - School programs including migrant, pre-school, school choice, **EL**, **Homeless**, and supplemental educational services as applicable.
 - Parent and Family Engagement Strategies, which is included in the Parent and Family Engagement Plan.
- You, as a Title I Parent, have a right to be involved in the development of the LEA Consolidated Plan.

What is the ACIP?



- The ACIP is your school's Alabama Continuous Improvement Plan and includes:
 - A Needs Assessment and Summary of Data
 - Goals and Strategies to Address Academic Needs of Students
 - Professional Development Needs for Staff
 - Coordination of Resources/Comprehensive Budget

BRHS Proposed Budget/Title Set aside.

Culture

Objectives

- To provide a safe, and supportive environment that supports student learning and staff development.

Critical Initiatives

- Increase the number of opportunities for positive student recognitions and leadership practices.
- Provide teachers with high quality professional development opportunities within the building to address student needs. This will be done monthly.
- Decrease the percentage of students that are chronically absent by 3%.
- Keep the total number of student incidents under 350 total for the 2025-26 school year.

Academics

Objectives

- To create an instructional framework that will increase student achievement, and improve ACT test skills.

Critical Initiatives

- Set a target goal of 100% Academic Growth from PreACT to ACT.
- Increase the number of students that move from level 1 proficiency to level 2 on Mock ACT and ACT assessments.
- Increase achievement and growth for students in specific subgroups (SpEd) by 10%

Student Leadership

Objectives

- To promote students to take ownership of their learning and provide opportunities for them to prepare for college and the workforce.

Critical Initiatives

- Increase the number of students to participate in Career Technical Courses.
- Increase the number of students to participate in Core Dual Enrollment courses for the school year.
- Create a framework that helps student improve on soft skills by engaging in resume writing and interview processes.
