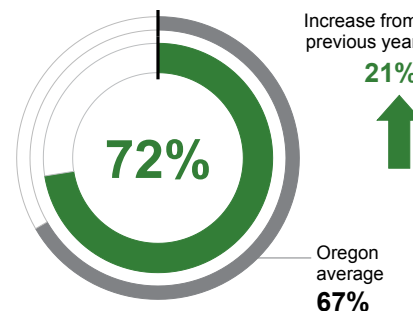
CLASS SIZE

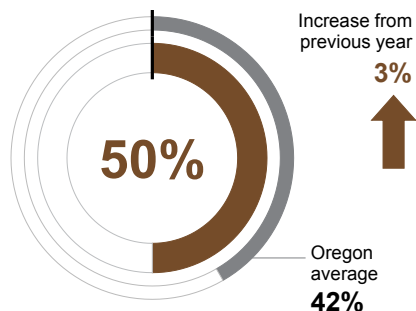

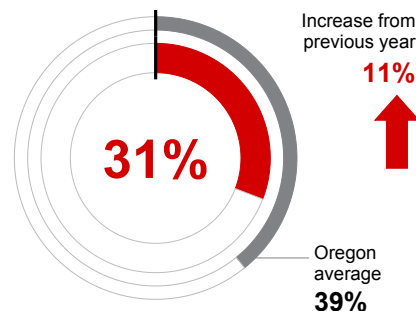
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



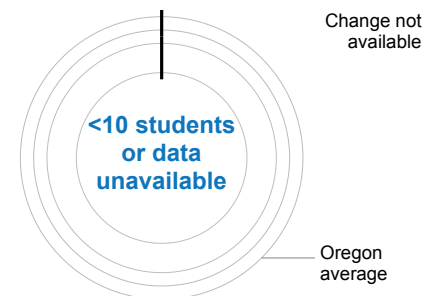
MATHEMATICS

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

BES is committed to a safe learning environment. Our school utilizes a positive behavioral approach by staff to reinforce expectations. A school counselor provides instruction to all students on social and emotional skills. For safety, students all receive a Child Protection Unit. We utilize a Standard Response Protocol (SRP) for emergency response.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Blodgett Elementary partners with the community to offer multiple extracurricular opportunities during and after the school day. Examples include field trips to local industry, guest speakers, artists in residence, and partnerships with town partners in Philomath for a variety of youth sports.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Parents play a vital role at Blodgett Elementary. We welcome parent volunteers in our buildings and create multiple opportunities for parents to engage in our school communities with whole-school community events and traditions. Examples of Parent Engagement opportunities include: Back to School Open House, seasonal theme celebrations, and music performances. Additionally, teachers engage parents in their student learning through conferences.
