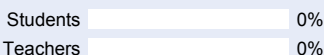

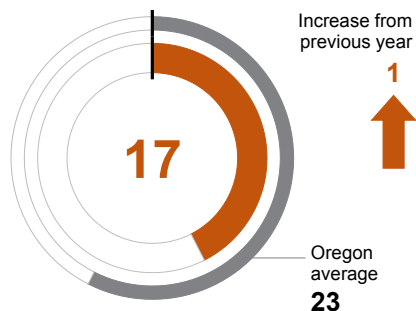

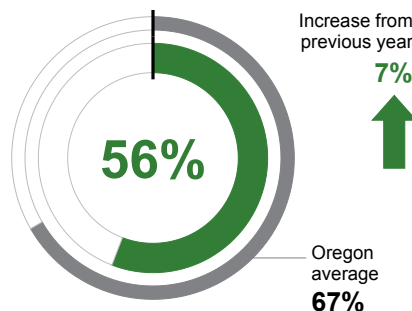
#### CLASS SIZE

#### REGULAR ATTENDERS

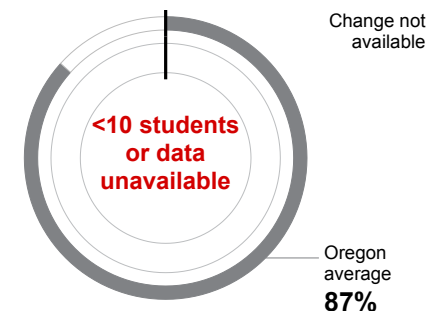

#### ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

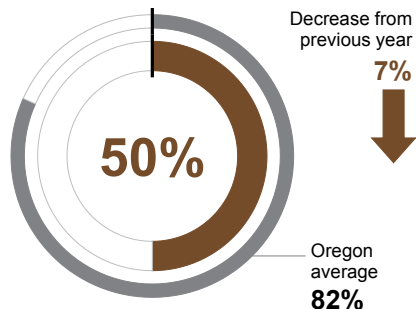
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



### Academic Success

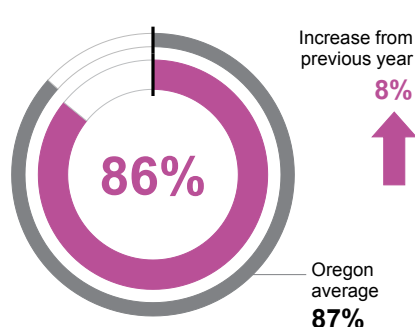
#### ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2020-21 graduating in 2023-24.



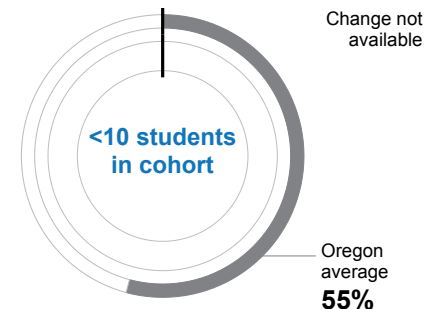
#### FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

### State Goals

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### About Our School

#### ADVANCED COURSEWORK

**WORLD LANGUAGE COURSES:** High school students are able to enroll in a world language course .

**AP, HONORS & DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES:** AP Courses are offered for high school students. Students from grades 9 through 12 are offered AP Sciences, History, Government, Math, and Literature classes. Honors courses in Literature are also available. We offer College Now, Chemeketa Partnership courses, and LBCC Partnership courses.

#### CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

- KVCS offers a Culinary CTE Pathway, with additional opportunities in Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources.
- Our Personal Finance and Career Foundations courses help students build practical skills, plan, and prepare for success beyond high school.
- YouScience is utilized to guide students in exploring career interests and identifying future opportunities.
- In their senior year, students participate in an internship experience, giving them valuable hands-on learning as they transition into life after graduation.

#### EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Field trips are an integral part of learning at KVCS, giving students hands-on experiences that connect classroom instruction to the real world. These trips provide opportunities to explore nearby natural areas, strengthen relationships with peers and adults, and engage in community service learning projects. Students may participate in athletics, after-school clubs, and regularly scheduled academic support sessions for additional help. For secondary students, regular socials provide structured opportunities to strengthen peer relationships beyond the classroom. Through these experiences, students engage in hands-on learning, relationship-building, and service that support both personal growth and academic success.

#### PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

KVCS actively promotes parent and community engagement to support student learning. Parents are encouraged to contribute 20 volunteer hours annually through classroom assistance, field trip supervision, and other school activities. Monthly "Project Days" provide opportunities for parents and community members to share skills and expertise with elementary students. The KVCS Parent Teacher Organization further contributes to school improvement through fundraising and community events. To ensure consistent communication regarding student achievement, KVCS schedules three sets of parent-teacher conferences each school year, and teachers strive to maintain ongoing communication with families outside of scheduled conferences.
