Burbank Adult School does not guarantee job, externship, or internship placement as a result of completing CTE courses.

Disability Services

Refund Policy

Students will only be entitled to a full refund in the event that a class is canceled OR if a student chooses to withdraw from a class at least two business days prior to the class start date. STUDENT SUCCESS STORY



Hello Friends!

This is **Mario Choto**, and I hold a **Bachelor's Degree in Computer Science from CSUN**.

But that degree didn't come easy. My journey began in a classroom at **Burbank Adult School**, where I first walked in not knowing a single word of English. I had only spoken Spanish my whole life, the language my parents raised me with, and I knew that if I wanted to grow, I had to start with the basics.

At Burbank Adult School, I enrolled in **ESL classes** and then continued with my **high school diploma**. It was more than just learning grammar or sentence structure, it was about learning how to navigate a new world. That small classroom became the foundation for everything that came after. With every new word I learned, I unlocked new possibilities for my future.

From there, I moved on to **Los Angeles Valley College**, where I found myself gaining confidence not only in the language but in academics. It was there that I realized I could actually pursue something bigger. I could build a career in something I was passionate about.

Eventually, I transferred to **California State University, Northridge (CSUN)**, where I earned my degree in **Computer Science**. At CSUN, I had the chance to work on real, meaningful projects. One of the most exciting was being part of the **Astro Cultivators** team at the **Autonomy Research Center for STEAHM (ARCS) sponsored by NASA**, where we developed AI-based object detection systems. Being part of such innovative work showed me just how far I had come from not knowing how to hold a conversation in English to developing technology that could one day support space exploration.

Along the way, I've been lucky to have mentors and professors who were patient, encouraging, and believed in me even when I was still learning how to believe in myself. One of my favorite quotes is: *"What we do here echoes in eternity."* That's how I feel about my journey. Every effort, every late night, will have an everlasting effect, a real impact on our future and our future generations.

As a **first-generation college graduate**, I carry not just my own dreams, but also the hopes of my family. Every step forward has been a win for all of us. Education, for me, has been the great equalizer. It reminded me that no matter how unfamiliar or intimidating a new challenge can be, **self-improvement through education will always turn things in your favor**.

To anyone starting over or starting from scratch: don't underestimate the power of small beginnings. You're not just learning a language or taking a class, you're building a future. And if I could do it, so can you.

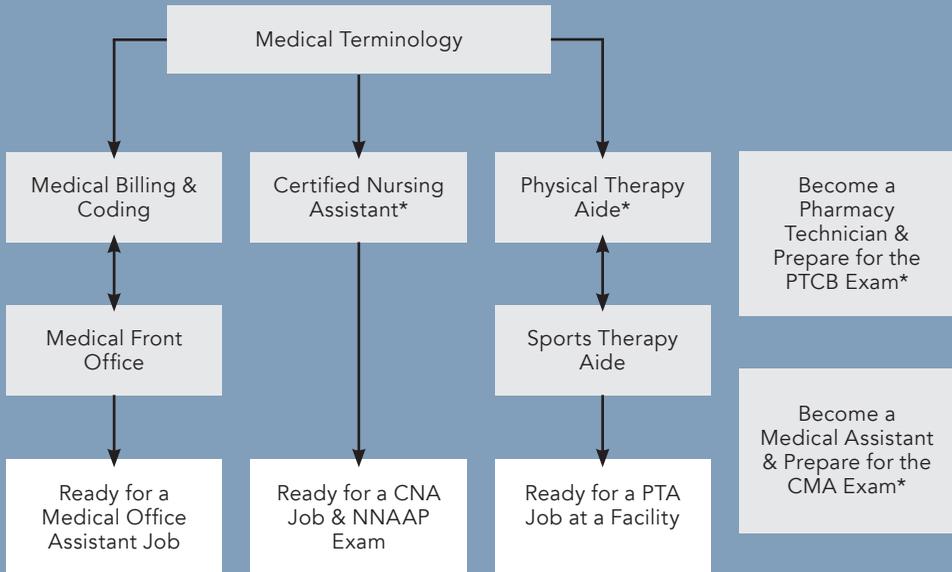

This course prepares students to work as physical therapy aides; to provide basic physical therapy treatment in health care facilities under the direction of licensed Physical therapists. Students will learn basic anatomy of selective body systems and scientifically based principles, medical terminology; the application of physical therapy treatment and therapeutic exercise. Students will also explore the relationships between physical therapists, physical therapy assistants and physical therapy aides. Students will receive hands-on training related to the assessment of vital signs, body mechanics, treatment methods, therapeutic, rehabilitative exercises and mobility training. *Program offers an externship. For the externship, students are required to complete the following: show TB results, proof of COVID vaccination and purchase Adult School scrubs at a cost of \$65 per set. English language learners are welcome.** The Pharmacy Technician assists the pharmacist with mixing and packaging prescriptions, maintaining client records, referring clients to the pharmacist for counseling, assisting with inventory control and purchasing, as well as collecting payment and coordinating billing. The curriculum includes materials to prepare graduates for the National Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) examination. Course requires completion of 120 externship hours in addition to theory/lecture. Prior to placement in an externship, all students must undergo a background check and live scan through the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the F.B.I.

****ESL Integrated Class** This entry level basic nursing course will prepare the student for employment as a Certified Nurse Assistant in both long-term and acute care hospital facilities. Graduates from the program will be prepared to take the National Nurse Aide Assessment (NNAAP) written and skills exam required for certification in the state of California. Students must demonstrate proficiency in written and verbal English, basic computer literacy, and the ability to push, pull, stand and lift a minimum of 50 lbs. Course instruction includes foundations of patient safety, patient/resident care, nutrition, restorative/rehabilitation care, and emergency procedures within the scope of practice of a California CNA.

Launch your career as a Phlebotomy technician, collecting blood samples from patients in a hospital, clinical laboratory, medical office, or clinic. 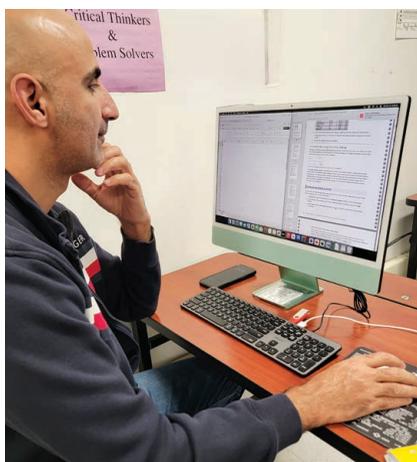

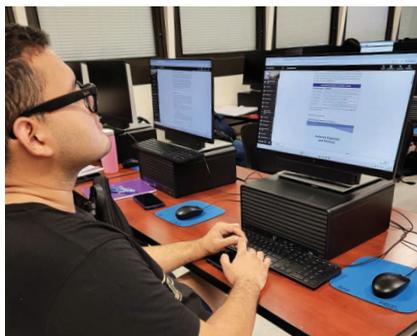
