(S or US grades are not included in the Grade Points)

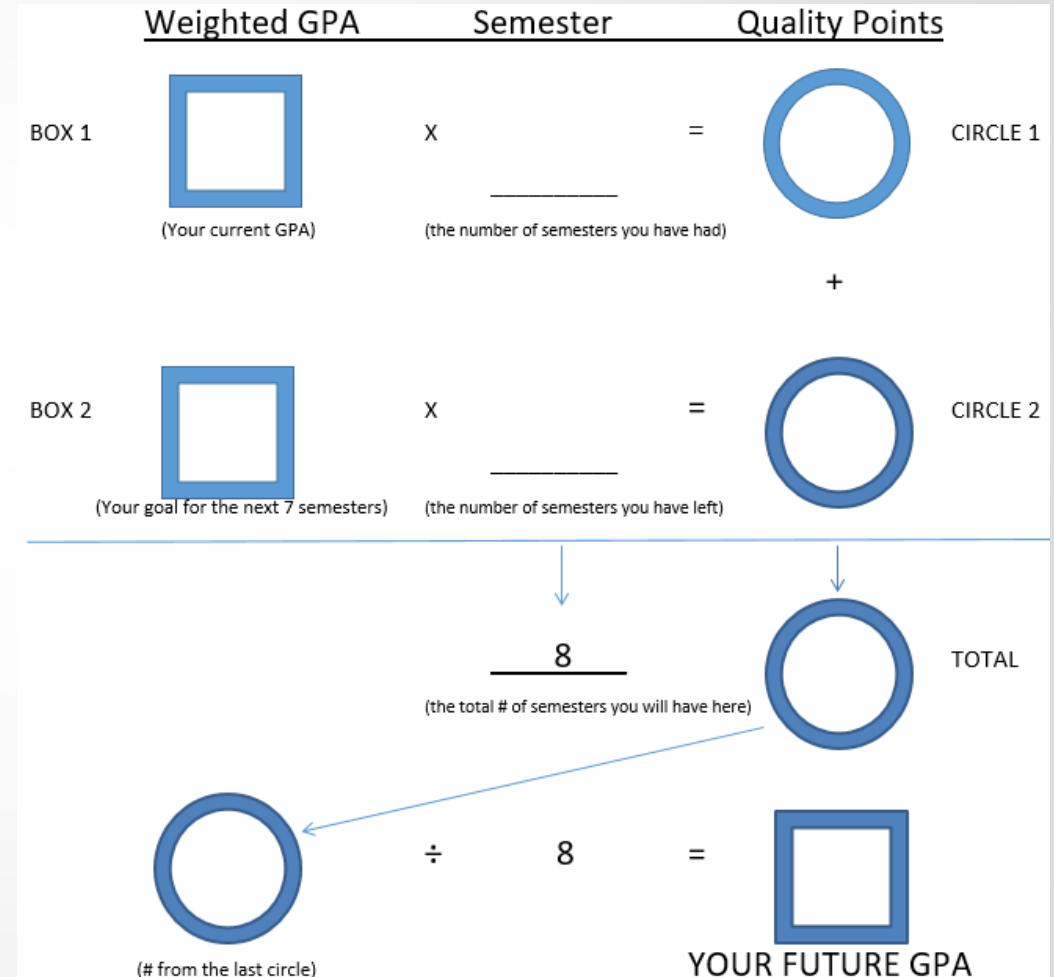
- Add up the "Points"
- Divide by the # of classes you have- do not include any classes that are Pass/Fail

# Okay, Now Let's Figure Out How to Predict Your Future G.P.A

- Remember, each semester gets averaged in with all of the other classes/semesters you have taken and will take.
- For example, a 3.0 from one full year and a 4.0 from the next semester, will not average out to a 3.5.
- It is important to set a goal G.P.A. to help you keep a steady rise on your transcript.
- Use this tool to figure out what your G.P.A. could be. Set realistic goals (could I do better in English, participated more in P.E. and so on)
