UNSOLVED MYSTERY



- Height: Approximately 7 feet tall!
- Skin: Green, "wet-like", scaly, and rough skin!
- Eyes: Glowing red eyes!
- Hands/Feet: Three fingers on each hand with long, black nails or claws, and three toes on each foot!
- Strength/Behavior: The creature was extremely strong and angry! It grabbed his car's door handle, jumped onto the roof, and clung to the vehicle as Davis sped away, causing significant damage like a ripped-off side-view mirror and deep scratches on the roof.

Law Enforcement: In 1988, following the initial sightings and reports of vehicle damage, the Lee County Sheriff's office, under Sheriff Liston Truesdale, conducted a serious investigation. Deputies found large, three-toed footprints (measuring about 14 inches) near some of the incidents and made plaster casts of them. However, these casts were later deemed unclassifiable by biologists from the S.C. Marine Resources Department, and the origin of the prints remains a mystery. **Media and Cryptozoology:** The legend gained national attention, drawing media from across the globe. Cryptozoology researchers, such as author Lyle Blackburn, have visited the area, spoken with witnesses, and investigated sighting locations. However, there is a lack of concrete evidence. Despite the various searches and the initial physical evidence of damaged cars, no definitive physical proof of the creature has ever been found. Skeptics suggest the damaged cars and footprints have mundane explanations, such as being caused by a bear, an alligator, an escaped exotic animal (like an emu), or being part of a hoax. 

Bats are beautiful, and they are also interesting. Did you know that bats use echolocation to find their food? Also, they are insectivores and pollinators.

They are normally black and brown, but some bats are red, tan, yellow, orange, gray, white, and sometimes even have patterns! Bats eat insects, pollen, fruit, and nectar. The scientific name of the bat is Chiroptera. Baby bats are called pups. Bats usually only have one pup per year, but sometimes they have twins. When the pups are 3 to 6 weeks old, they learn how to fly, and not long after that, when they are 6 to 8 weeks old, they go off on their own. Hopefully, after reading this, you won't think bats are as creepy as you thought before.

Deviled Eggs

Ingredients

- Eggs
- Mayonnaise
- Mustard
- Steamer Basket





Preparation

1. Gather as many eggs as wanted. The type of eggs do not matter. As many eggs as you get, there will be twice as many deviled eggs.
2. Put eggs in a steamer basket and put the steamer basket over the stove for 13 minutes. Set oven heat to medium.
3. Pour water into a bowl then add ice until water is freezing. Put eggs into the bowl and wait for 15 minutes.
4. After, take the eggs out and peel the shell off. After you peel off the shell, cut the eggs in half.
5. Use a spoon to take the yolk(yellow stuff) out of every egg and put them all in a small bowl or a cup. Put the mustard and mayonnaise into the bowl or cup (no certain amount needed). Put one drop of honey in for every full egg. Stir until well combined.
6. Add yolk mixture to each half egg until barely over top. Put on a plate.
7. Serve to friends and family!



Did you know that the full moon in October is known as the "hunter's moon," named by the Algonquin people because it marked the season for hunting before winter?





“It's ok Saffy, we will find her,” Noah whispered.


“You're right, Noah. Pack your things, we're going to find mom, I said. “I won't just sit and pout; we are going to find mom,” I cried.
