A Message from the Superintendent

Adapting to the needs of our community today and in the future

Our district has a strong tradition of community elementary schools that serve our local cities and neighborhoods. Over time, neighborhoods change, children grow up, family households become empty nest households, and new families move into new neighborhoods. This creates a shift in the numbers of school-age children for each elementary school, and a need for the

district to periodically re-balance the numbers of students that are served by each school. We do this by adjusting attendance boundaries and moving some neighborhoods into different elementary school attendance areas.

The needs of any community will change over time. As a school district, we must also adapt to be responsive to our community. With the help of many community members, staff and demographic experts, we have crafted a plan that will help our district meet the needs of our community now and in the future.

In 2025, Forest Lake Area Schools completed this adjustment process, with input from many staff members and members of the community. As a result, beginning next fall, homes and neighborhoods may lie within a different elementary school attendance boundary than they did before.

Changing boundaries and balancing student enrollment across the district helps ensure that each student has access to the support and resources they need. It also creates efficiencies for each school and balances operational costs across the district.


Sewing Machine Quick-Start | Age 16-Adult

Our knowledgeable staff can help your family reach their swimming and safety goals! Passing swim lesson Levels 1-4 will give a swimmer most of the skills needed to be a confident swimmer (listed below). Levels 5-7 will continue to work on all of the basic strokes, introduce the breaststroke, butterfly and work on distance swimming.

A "swimmer" should successfully be able to:

- · Swim the front crawl with rhythmic breathing for 25 yards
- Swim on their back with a finning arm action and flutter kick or back crawl for 25 yards
- · Jump or dive into deep water
- Tread water in deep water for one minute
- Back float in deep water for one minute
- Change swim positions from front to back and back to front in deep water

Classes are based on skill progression. Refer to class descriptions and eligibility requirements when selecting the class that best fits your child.

Sibling Care

Depending on staff availability, we are happy to offer Sibling Care on parent days in an ECFE class for children who are not enrolled in a class. What Happens in ECFE Classes?

1. TOGETHER TIME

Class begins with family/child activities designed to enhance your child's learning. You will also get ideas for things you can do together at home.

2. FAMILY TIME

Families participate in a discussion led by a parent educator. We will explore topics such as child development, discipline, family interaction and other areas of interest.

3. CHILDREN'S TIME

While family members are in the discussion group in another room (for separating classes), children learn through activities designed by an early childhood teacher to help them grow and develop their social, emotional, cognitive, physical and communication skills.

Baby Basics Family Resource Cupboard

The ECFE staff, Parent Advisory Council and STEP students have partnered to provide a community resource for families in our community by opening a Community Closet offering free items to families. Items may include gently used clothing, diapers, pull-ups, baby and child hygiene items, baby food and formula.

FREE | ECFE Home Education Program

ECFE Home Education Program is a voluntary parent education program offered to families who are expecting a child or have children under the age of kindergarten entry. ECFE Home Education Program helps to establish positive partnerships between home, school and the community. This program plays a vital role in supporting families and children from early learning and understanding of important developmental milestones. Periodic screening increase a parent's understanding of their children's development progress, as well as informing them of any possible delays.

Early intervention for identified concerns helps improve school readiness for young children. This evidence-based early childhood program is designed to offer regularly scheduled family personal visits, annual developmental screening, monthly group connections and access to a network and resources. These components are integral in supporting and preparing children, families, schools and communities toward school readiness.

The ECFE Home Education Program provides opportunities to assist families with a smooth transition into preschool and kindergarten. We offer three main topics to start with: health and safety, parents as teachers and parent/child bonding. Each area will cover information related to the topic along with an activity to go along with the topic. Once your registration has been received, an early childhood teacher will contact you to schedule a session that fits your schedule. Early Childhood Screening

SCREEN AT 3!

Early Childhood Screening is a free and simple check of your child's growth, development and learning. Screening is conducted in a child-friendly setting and the process is age-appropriate and fun for children. Screening at 3 is preferred, but a child may be screened between the ages of three and the start of kindergarten as required by law.



What can I expect at a screening appointment?

A trained professional will check your child's:

- · Vision and hearing
- · Height and weight
- Immunizations (shots)
- Large and small muscles
- · Thinking, language and communication skills
- Social and emotional development



What should I bring to a screening appointment?

- Questions you have about your child's growth and development
- · Your child's immunization record (shots)
- Your child's primary health care provider's (doctor) name and phone number
- Your child's birth certificate



When are screening appointments available?

Screening appointments are held Monday, Wednesday and Thursday throughout the school year at the FLAS Education Center and some dates during the summer. Visit www.flaschools.org/screening for more information.



MORE INFORMATION

This screening may help you link to other free learning opportunities such as prekindergarten programming, Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE), Minnesota early learning scholarships for high-quality care and education, Head Start, Home Visiting and Early Childhood Special Education. Your child may also be screened at their Head Start, Child and Teen Check-ups or a developmental screening clinic. Parents may conscientiously object to screening; Minnesota Statutes 121A.17.

Engagement in Early Childhood

The FLAS Early Childhood Programs have been implementing the Classroom Engagement Model (CEM) in all classrooms. CEM is a set of research—based teaching practices that increase engagement and full participation of every child. Increased engagement leads to more learning, increased skill acquisition and better developmental outcomes for children.

What is Engagement?

Engagement is the amount of time your child spends participating in an activity. We can help children be more engaged when they are doing activities like building blocks, swinging with a friend, cleaning up their toys or helping set the table.

Why is Engagement important?

When children are engaged, they are ready for learning! Children have more opportunities to practice their goals. Engaging all children leads to meaningful participation and inclusion.

What does CEM mean in our program?

Early Childhood staff are attending trainings and will be coached to use the strategies they learn. Children will practice learning goals in every routine. Everyone is working together to support every child.





4 Star Parent Aware Rated

Little Rangers Preschool has a 4 star rating from Parent Aware. This is the highest possible rating! Families utilize Parent Aware Star Ratings to identify early childhood programs employing research-based best practices for children's school and life readiness.

Programs voluntarily engage in the rating process, undergoing additional training beyond basic licensing requirements to earn One-, Two-, Three- or Four- Star Ratings. These ratings reflect demonstrated use of research-based practices, with each level building upon the previous one. This system enables families to easily discern the specific practices employed by the program.

Childcare for Full Day Students

Providing childcare is essential to make preschool accessible for all. Children enrolled in Little Rangers Full Day Preschool have the opportunity to register for School Age Care (SAC); a before and after school childcare program available only on days your child is enrolled in Little Rangers Full Day Preschool at any location. Students attending Little Rangers Full Day Preschool at the Education Center can register for SAC at Forest View. Childcare is not available for students enrolled in Half Day Preschool. Call (651) 982-8365 for more information.

Transportation for Preschool

A caregiver, 18 years or older, is expected to be at the bus stop for pick up and drop off to escort the child on and off the bus. Our hope is that by providing this service, it will be easier for families to participate in a high quality early learning experience. Space is limited and dependent on availability of existing bus routes. This service is offered free of charge. Call (651) 982-8349 for more information.

- Four and five year old preschoolers (age as of September 1) can ride the bus.
- Children who enroll in Half Day Preschool can ride the bus to school in the morning or ride the bus home at the end of the day.
- Mid-day transportation is not available.
- Children who enroll in Full Day Preschool have the option of riding the bus to and from school.
- Transportation is available for students who attend preschool at the elementary school where their home address is assigned and at the Education Center for those in the Forest View Elementary busing area.





Preschool Fee Assistance

FLAS Early Childhood Programs have a variety of fee assistance options available based on the program your child is enrolled in and your family circumstances. All fee assistance is confidential. Note: Financial assistance is not available for students five years of age as of September 1.

Pathway I Scholarship

Pathway I Scholarships are awarded directly to families who meet eligibility requirements. Applications can be completed online by going to the Early Learning Scholarship Hub: EarlyLearningScholarshipsHub.mn.gov

Pathway II Scholarship

FLAS Early Childhood Programs receives limited funding from the Minnesota Department of Education to help families cover the cost of preschool for students who are three or four years old.

School Readiness Financial Aid

Through School Readiness, we can offer limited financial assistance to qualifying families. There is an application process to complete. Children must meet specific criteria based on the sliding fee adapted by FLAS Early Childhood Programs to participate.

Voluntary Pre-K

FLAS Early Childhood Programs have received funding through Voluntary Pre-K (VPK) for Lino Lakes Elementary and Forest View Elementary for the two-day Little Rangers Preschool Full Day Preschool program. Children must meet specific criteria to qualify.

Registration

- Registration for the 2025-2026 school year began on January 21, 2025. Registration for the 2026-2027 school year begins on January 20, 2026.
- A non-refundable registration fee of \$50 is due with registration.
- Classes began the week of September 8, 2025 and end the week of June 1, 2026.
- Children must be the appropriate age by September 1, 2025; no exceptions.
- Required forms can be found online at www.flaschools.org/ecforms.
- You may fax your child's forms directly to us at (651) 982-8375 or email them to earlychildhood@flaschools.org.
- If you need required forms mailed to you, please call (651) 982-8349.

Class Fees

- Invoices will be emailed at the beginning of the month and due by the 15th of the month to avoid a \$10 late fee.
- Preschool class fees are based on a daily rate per contract day. You will be invoiced the actual number of contracted days per month.
- Class fees and times listed on the following pages are subject to modification.
- All programs will be invoiced from September - June. Receive a 2% discount if the year is paid in full.
- No refunds will be given for an absence or a school closing (inclement weather days).

2025-2026 Preschool Classes

The last day to join a preschool class in the current school year is March 1, 2026.

Full Day Classes

Full Day Preschool is offered at seven locations throughout the district for four and five year old children. Students attending Full Day Preschool will be offered a free district provided breakfast and lunch. Fee assistance is available (page 57).

Family Learning Program (FLP)

Designed for parents with children ages birth-5 years of age

The Family Learning Program (FLP) is ideal for caregivers of young children (birth-5 years old) and would like to register for Adult Basic Education (ABE). Families can enjoy a meal together, participate in guided learning experiences and get ideas for home activities. Children 12 weeks-2 years old attend Sibling Care (childcare) and 3-5 year olds attend preschool while caregivers participate in parent education classes and work on goals, such as GED test preparation, improving their English or basic skills in our ABE program. Children ages birth to 11 weeks old stay with their caregiver during classes. Children will enroll in the Tuesday/Thursday Half Day AM class that is appropriate for their age. Daily tuition for children is based on a sliding fee scale. All families are welcome. No child will be turned away because of the inability to pay.


