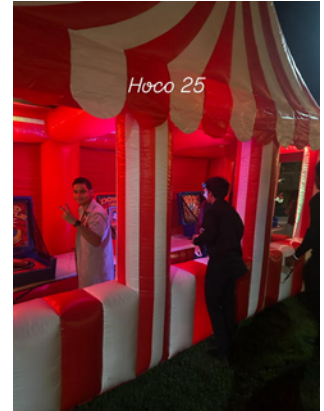

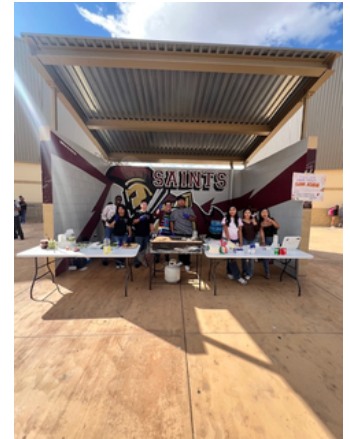

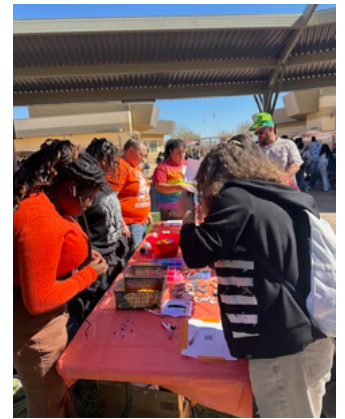
PUMPKIN PAINTING
