Regular Board Meeting

Tuesday, September 23, 2025

1. CALL TO ORDER

President Bustos called the meeting to order at 5:02 p.m.

Other Board members present were Ms. Brazer Aceves, Ms. Magdaleno, and Ms. Lebsack.

Mr. Bustos announced closed session items including Conference with Labor Negotiator, Personnel Matters, Existing Litigation, Anticipated Litigation, and Conference with Real Property Negotiators.

There was no one wishing to address the Board regarding closed session items.

2. RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular Board meeting recessed to closed session at 5:02 p.m.

5. LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

I want to acknowledge that this land we refer to as Orange County, is the unceded and traditional lands of the Gabrielino Tongva Nation, and the Juaneño Band of Mission Indians Acjachemen Nation. These lands were taken through a process of colonization, physical, and cultural genocide. I want to pay my respect to elders, both past and present, as well as the Tongva and Acjachemen Youth who have attended, are currently attending our schools, or in the neighboring districts.

Superintendent Perez highlighted several key events and recognitions. She announced the upcoming College and Career Fair on Thursday, October 23, to be held at the Heritage Museum of Orange County, featuring over 100 in-state and out-of-state colleges, universities, community organizations, and District programs. The event is open to students of all ages and will include entertainment, food trucks, raffles, and direct access to college and career representatives. She also invited the community to the State of the District Breakfast on October 31 at 7:00 AM, hosted by the Santa Ana Public Schools Foundation. The event will showcase high school Career Technical Education (CTE) programs through interactive student-led presentations and serve as a fundraiser for student scholarships. ### 15. BOARD REPORTS

Ms. Lebsack expressed concerns about bias and intolerance within state-level teachers' unions. She advocated for first amendment protections for educators, encouraged staff to consider alternative professional associations, and expressed support for school choice.

Dr. Alvarez addressed concerns around dyslexia raised by public speakers and perceived lack of responsiveness to emails sent to the Board. He explained his practice of forwarding public correspondence to the Superintendent for appropriate action. He emphasized the importance of dignity, justice, peace, and treating all individuals with respect, reinforcing these values as central to his approach to public service.

Ms. Magdaleno thanked Dr. Alvarez for echoing parent concerns voiced during public comments. She requested that the District consider formally recognizing Deaf Awareness Month in future Septembers, referencing Taft Elementary's program. She also asked for follow-up regarding a parent issue raised at Carver Elementary and concluded with well wishes to attendees.

Ms. Brazer-Acevez shared a recent visit to Jackson Elementary, where she spent time in classrooms observing literacy and multilingual support strategies in action. She praised the consistent use of instructional methods like GLAD and Thinking Maps and was inspired by the school's inclusive education practices. She also discussed a meeting with Orange County Workforce and Economic Development leaders about creating paid internship opportunities for SAUSD students. She expressed appreciation for the opportunity to observe effective practices and engage with students and educators.

Mr. Bustos thanked attendees and reported on visits to Pio Pico's Dual Language Academy and Monroe Elementary, where he engaged with staff about the impacts of immigration enforcement and recent staffing reductions. He also attended Carver Elementary's Hispanic Heritage celebration and commended the sense of community. In closing, he addressed a Board member's public declaration of support for school choice and urged the community to remain vigilant and supportive of public education.



26 WHEREAS, the governing Board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as  
27 applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, and;

28 WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 23, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. o'clock, which is on or before  
29 the eighth week of school and;

30 WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in  
31 each school in the district has, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content  
32 standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code 33126 in each of the following  
33 subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the

- 35 (i) Mathematics,
- 36 (ii) Science,
- 37 (iii) History-social science,
- 38 (iv) English/language arts, including the English language development component of an

- 40 (v) Visual and performing arts. (Not listed in 60605 or 33126)

41 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing Board makes the determination that each pupil  
42 of the district, has available sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content  
43 standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed  
44 above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board and adopted  
45 by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

46 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2025-26 school year, the Santa Ana Unified School District, has  
47 provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content  
48 standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed  
49 above, consistent with the content and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum framework adopted by

19 purchases, so long as "the aggregate amount of the procurement transaction does not  
20 exceed the micro-purchase threshold," and provides that, "[t]o the extent  
21 practicable, the recipient or subrecipient should distribute micro-purchases  
22 equitably among qualified suppliers"; and

24 **WHEREAS**, 2 CFR Section 200.320(a)(1)(ii) provides that, among other things, a  
25 non-Federal entity may award micro-purchases "without soliciting competitive price  
26 or rate quotations if the recipient or subrecipient considers the price reasonable

28 maintains documents to support its conclusion"; and

**EXHIBIT "A"**  
**CALIFORNIA PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE SECTION 20111**

**20111.**

(a) (1) The governing board of any school district, in accordance with any requirement established by that governing board pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 2000, shall let any contracts involving an expenditure of more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for any of the following:

(A) The purchase of equipment, materials, or supplies to be furnished, sold, or leased to the district.

(B) Services, except construction services.

(C) Repairs, including maintenance as defined in Section 20115, that are not a public project as defined in subdivision (c) of Section 22002.

(2) The governing board shall let the contract to the lowest responsible bidder who shall give security as the board requires, or else reject all bids.

(b) (1) The governing board shall let any contract for a public project, as defined in subdivision (c) of Section 22002, involving an expenditure of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) or more, to the lowest responsible bidder who shall give security as the board requires, or else reject all bids. All bids for construction work shall be presented under sealed cover, and shall be accompanied by one of the following forms of bidder's security:

(A) Cash.

(B) A cashier's check made payable to the school district.

(C) A certified check made payable to the school district.

(D) A bidder's bond executed by an admitted surety insurer, made payable to the school district.

(2) Upon award to the lowest bidder, the security of an unsuccessful bidder shall be returned in a reasonable period of time, but in no event shall that security be held by the school district beyond 60 days from the time the award is made.

(c) Procurement bid solicitations and awards made by a school district approved to operate at least one federal nonprofit child nutrition program for purchases in support of those programs shall be consistent with the federal procurement standards in Sections 200.318 to 200.326, inclusive, of Part 200 of Title 2 of the Code of Federal Regulations. These awards shall be let to the most responsive and responsible party. The price shall be the primary consideration, but not the only determining factor.

(d) This section applies to all equipment, materials, or supplies, whether patented or otherwise, and to contracts awarded pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 2000. This section shall not apply to professional services or advice, insurance services, or any other purchase or service otherwise exempt from this section, or to any work done by day labor or by force account pursuant to Section 20114.

(e) Commencing January 1, 1997, the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall annually adjust the dollar amounts specified in subdivision (a) to reflect the percentage change in the annual average value of the Implicit Price Deflator for State and Local Government Purchases of Goods and Services for the United States, as published by the United States Department of Commerce for the 12-month period ending in the prior fiscal year. The annual adjustments shall be rounded to the nearest one hundred dollars (\$100).

Dear County and District Superintendents, County and District Chief Business Officials, and Charter School Administrators:

**Annual Adjustment to Bid Threshold for Contracts Awarded by School Districts**

*Public Contract Code (PCC)* Section 20111(a) requires school district governing boards to competitively bid and award any contracts involving an expenditure of more than \$50,000, adjusted for inflation, to the lowest responsible bidder. Contracts subject to competitive bidding include:

1. Purchase of equipment, materials, or supplies to be furnished, sold, or leased to the school district.
2. Services that are not construction services.
3. Repairs, including maintenance as defined in *PCC* Section 20115, that are not public projects as defined in *PCC* Section 22002(c).

The State Superintendent of Public Instruction (State Superintendent) is required to annually adjust the \$50,000 amount specified in *PCC* Section 20111(a) to reflect the percentage change in the annual average value of the Implicit Price Deflator for State and Local Government Purchases of Goods and Services for the United States, as published by the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analyst (BEA) for the 12-month period ending in the prior fiscal year. The inflation adjustment is rounded to the nearest one hundred dollars (\$100).

Pursuant to the above calculation, and effective January 1, 2025, the State Superintendent has determined that the inflation adjusted bid threshold will increase from \$114,500 to \$114,800. Shown below are the inflation adjusted bid thresholds for the current and two prior years.

Calendar Year	Bid Threshold	Percentage Change in Implicit Price Deflator
2023	\$109,300	10.32%
2024	\$114,500	4.79%
2025	\$114,800	0.259%

Also note that public projects as defined in *PCC* Section 22002(c), such as construction or reconstruction of publicly owned facilities, have a lower bid threshold of \$15,000 that is not adjusted for inflation. For more information on bidding requirements for all projects, refer to *PCC* sections 20110 to 20118.4.

**EXHIBIT "C"**  
**CALIFORNIA PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE SECTIONS 22030 AND 22032**

**22030.**

(a) This article applies only to a public agency whose governing board has by resolution elected to become subject to the uniform construction cost accounting procedures set forth in Article 2 (commencing with Section 22010) and which has notified the Controller of that election. In the event of a conflict with any other provision of law relative to bidding procedures, this article shall apply to any public agency which has adopted a resolution and so notified the Controller.

(b) A county, whether general law or charter, containing a population of less than 500,000 may award individual annual contracts as provided in Section 20128.5.

*(Amended by Stats. 2015, Ch. 269, Sec. 28. (SB 184) Effective January 1, 2016.)*

**22032.**

(a) Public projects of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) or less may be performed by the employees of a public agency by force account, by negotiated contract, or by purchase order.

(b) Public projects of two hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$220,000) or less may be let to contract by informal procedures as set forth in this article.

(c) Public projects of more than two hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$220,000) shall, except as otherwise provided in this article, be let to contract by formal bidding procedure.

6 **Revised Appropriations Limits for Fiscal Years 2024-25 and 2025-26**

7  
8 **WHEREAS**, Article XIII B of the California Constitution provides certain  
9 limitations and controls on the total annual appropriations of any school district;  
10 and,

11  
12 **WHEREAS**, Division 9, (commencing with Section 7900) of Title 1 of the Government  
13 Code provides for the implementation of Article XIII B; and,

14  
15 **WHEREAS**, Education Code Section 42132 provides that the Governing Body of each  
16 school district shall annually adopt a resolution to identify the estimated  
17 appropriations limit for the district for the current fiscal year and the actual  
18 appropriations limit for the district for the preceding fiscal year on or before  
19 September 15 of each year; and,

20  
21 **WHEREAS**, the documentation used in determining the appropriations limits for  
22 fiscal years 2024-25 and 2025-26 is available for public inspection in the Office of  
23 the Associate Superintendent, Business Services.

24  
25 **WHEREAS**, this resolution is being resubmitted with revisions to reflect updated  
26 appropriation limit figures for Fiscal Years 2024-25 and 2025-26, ensuring accuracy  
27 in reporting; and,

28  
29 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:** That the Board of Education hereby declares as  
30 follows:

31 1. The actual appropriations limit for 2024-25 was \$334,916,796.73 (as  
32 revised), and the appropriations in the 2024-25 budget did not exceed the limitations  
33 imposed by Article XIII B of the California Constitution.

34 2. The appropriations limit for 2025-26 is estimated to be \$234,552,878.54 (as  
35 revised), and the appropriations in the 2025-26 budget do not exceed the limitations  
36 imposed by Article XIII B of the California Constitution.

7 Proclamation Declaring October 2025  
8 as LGBTQ+ History Month

11 **WHEREAS**, the Santa Ana Unified School District prides itself on its diversity  
12 and inclusiveness, providing safe and welcoming spaces for students, regardless of  
13 race, ethnicity, national origin, language, disability status, gender expression  
14 or identity, sexual orientation, and religion; and

15 **WHEREAS**, on June 15, 2020, in a landmark decision for lesbian, gay, bisexual,  
16 transgender, and queer/questioning (LGBTQ+) persons, the U.S. Supreme Court gave  
17 recognition to the LGBTQ+ community of individuals, and they should enjoy the  
18 protection of the law; and

19 **WHEREAS**, state law, under the FAIR Education Act, Senate Bill 48, requires  
20 that California K-12 schools provide Fair, Accurate, Inclusive, and Respectful  
21 (FAIR) representations of people with disabilities and people who are lesbian,  
22 gay, bisexual, or transgender in our curricula, and requires the inclusion of  
23 LGBTQ+ history in schools; and

24 **WHEREAS**, the state and local policies and practices are increasingly  
25 acknowledging and focusing on LGBTQ+ youth and numerous national advocacy and  
26 other organizations are giving greater attention to LGBTQ+ youth on their work.  
27 Acceptance and support for all youth, including those who are LGBTQ+, make  
28 communities and schools safer places; and

29 **WHEREAS**, as many as 11.5 percent of California students in middle and  
30 high schools identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer,  
31 questioning, intersex, asexual, gender nonconforming, gender fluid, and  
32 gender nonbinary (LGBTQ+); and

33 **WHEREAS**, youth identifying as LGBTQ+ are overrepresented in the populations  
34 of youth experiencing homelessness; youth who are the victims of bullying and  
35 discrimination, including, among other things, someone trying to convince them to

36 change their sexuality or gender identity; and youth who have attempted or died as  
37 a result of suicide; and

38 **WHEREAS**, every school district, including ours, must continue to do more to  
39 ensure our LGBTQ+ youth have the supports and resources they need to achieve  
40 academically and feel socially, emotionally, mentally, and physically safe at  
41 school; and

42 **WHEREAS**, for youth identifying as LGBTQ+, the District understands the  
43 importance of supporting a student's gender identity by providing a safe and  
44 inclusive school climate and promoting appropriate resources, including an  
45 individualized Identity Support Plan. The purpose of the Identity Support Plan is  
46 to identify the individual needs of identified LGBTQ+ students in accordance with  
47 the School Success and Opportunity Act (Assembly Bill AB1266). We are committed to  
48 advocating for safe and supportive environments for ALL students, regardless of  
49 gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, or expression; and

50 **WHEREAS**, among other supports, the District has developed a memorandum of  
51 understanding with the LGBTQ Center OC to ensure that all LGBTQ+ youth and students  
52 in the District have access to community resources, education, and social services  
53 through various available programs.

54 **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Santa Ana Unified School District  
55 remains committed to inspire equity, create alliances, celebrate diversity, and  
56 establish safe environments in our schools and communities; and

57 **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Board of Trustees of the  
58 Santa Ana Unified School District recognizes October 2025 as LGBTQ+ History Month,  
59 October 11 as National Coming Out Day, and November 20 as Transgender Day of  
60 Remembrance to honor the many achievements and contributions of the LGBTQ+  
61 community, National Day of Silence on April 10, 2026, as a movement against the  
62 harassment and bullying of individuals identifying with the LGBTQ+ community,  
63 celebrating June 2026 as LGBTQ+ Pride Month; and

64 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Board of Trustees encourages all schools to  
65 hold commemorative activities in honor of LGBTQ+ History Month in October 2025, as  
66 well as, during the above mentioned commemoration days.
