Principal Report:

Students can walk in and make appointments for in school tutors through schoology, but mostly students are pulled from classes to come for tutoring. Data shows 9th and 10th grade struggle the most and need the most support.

The interventions are designed to help the kids who don't qualify for IEP's but still need help.

There is a 5 year plan to make this program better and help fill in the gaps kids have.
