DWIGHT GLOBAL ONLINE SCHOOL

Founded in 2014 as a pioneer in online education, and now ranked the #1 online high school in the U.S., Dwight Global offers students worldwide a college-preparatory experience equivalent to that of a brick-and-mortar independent school, but with greater accessibility. Dwight Global attracts students dedicated to making an impact in their communities, as elite athletes and dancers, musicians, researchers and entrepreneurs. They are drawn to Dwight Global for its rigorous academics, including extensive AP and IB offerings, synchronous classes offered in fifteen time zones, a diverse student body, and rich opportunities for connection and exploration.

THE DWIGHT SCHOOLS

Founded in 1872 in New York, The Dwight Schools is a world-renowned network of independent International Baccalaureate World Schools with a combined student body representing over 50 nationalities. Dwight has brick-and-mortar campuses in New York, London, Seoul, Shanghai, Dubai, and Hanoi; as well as a campus in the cloud, Dwight Global Online School. Each campus is independent, yet connected to the network's central administration in New York, ensuring that all students receive an equally excellent, personalized educational experience.

THE DWIGHT NETWORK

Dwight Global students may cross-register at any Dwight brick-and-mortar campus, and students at four of our Dwight campuses are currently enrolled in courses through Dwight Global. Students residing in New York have the opportunity to earn a diploma from Dwight School New York upon completion of graduation requirements.



Dwight Global received international recognition when it was selected by the International Baccalaureate in 2022 as an initial partner for this pilot. Dwight Global is also a member of the World Academy of Sport, an international organization dedicated to providing highly competitive athletes the time and space to excel in both academics and athletics. The WAoS gives top national and/or international athletes access to the IB Diploma program through a unique three-year pathway.

In-Person Connections



Dwight Global is committed to bringing our community together through global initiatives, educational opportunities, and artistic engagement. Each year, our **Dwight Global Concert** gathers students from across all Dwight campuses to promote musical and artistic collaboration. Twice a year, Dwight Global's school-wide events unite our students, faculty, and administration. **Orientation** kicks off the school year through exploration, teamwork, and relationship building. During **STEAM Weekend**, students and faculty traverse NYC together and tackle theme-based team challenges at Dwight New York's science labs. Dwight Global's highly competitive Villars scholarships furthers the schools commitment to civic and global engagement and provides students the opportunity to attend the exclusive **Villars Symposium**, a platform for systemic change and a place for intergenerational collaboration.

Educational Innovation



A pioneer in adopting Virtual Reality (VR) in the K-12 educational landscape, Dwight Global is revolutionizing how students engage with science. Curated by faculty, VR labs provide an immersive and interactive environment with two modes of participation: a single-user play mode that supports mastery-based learning and individual practice, and a collaborative group mode, fostering critical skills such as communication and teamwork alongside scientific practical skills.

Grade Reporting

- Given the two very rigorous and different curricular paths offered at Dwight Global, we do not add weight to any courses, nor do we report an official GPA on our transcript.

2025-26 ACADEMIC UPDATES

INDEPENDENT STUDIES

Dwight Global offers a range of specialized academic opportunities that allow students to pursue advanced, individualized, or niche areas of study. We are excited to support the academic trajectory of our exceptional and intellectually curious students. Independent Studies will be noted on a student's transcript.

Advanced Independent Study | For students who have already surpassed the highest level of a subject offered in our curriculum, our Advanced Study course reflects the rigor of a 200-level college course. Focused on current scholarly topics, theories and/or research, each course culminates in a student-designed and developed thesis project under the guidance of a faculty mentor.
2025-26 offering: *Advanced Independent Study: French Literature*

Individualized Study | Available for students who wish to focus on a specific topic or field not otherwise offered at Dwight Global. These studies are offered at the standard or honors level, are tailored to individual interests, and may include research, creative work, or applied learning. Each course is taught by a subject area teacher/expert synchronously, and the course meets Dwight Global's required instructional hours.

INTENSIVE COURSES

Dwight Global is expanding our intensive summer course model and will offer limited opportunities for students to enroll in twelve-week asynchronous courses for select standard and honors courses. Intensive courses will continue to be primarily offered during the summer, and all courses follow the curriculum outlined in our course curriculum guide and earn a student a full course credit. While asynchronous, all students work with an experienced subject teacher.

SPECIAL COURSES

Dwight Global is dedicated to providing robust and rigorous course offerings to all our students. When a course does not meet our minimum enrollment, we are able to continue to provide students the opportunity to enroll with a fee. Starting in 2026-27, limited financial assistance for special courses will be made available through a grant application.
