

PAWS-ITIVE REFERRALS!

Nashport Elementary staff are celebrating student success in a few new ways this year. Students are rewarded for good behavior through PAWS-itive referrals to the office with rewards such as Pizza with the Principal and Super Scottie Breakfast. Students can earn PAWS-itive Referrals for following any of the four Nashport Expectations: Respectful, Responsible, Ready and Safe. They earn a certificate and a small prize. Their name goes into a monthly drawing for a \$20 gift card to the place of their choice. Gift cards are sponsored by the Nashport PTO. Students are learning monthly character traits this year. At the end of every month, classroom teachers choose one student who embodies that character trait. Those students join Mrs. Knowlton and Mrs. Spiker for Pizza with the Principal. Pizzas are provided by Main Street Pizza in Dresden. Finally, the Super Scottie Breakfast tradition continues! Classroom teachers choose one student from each class for exemplary behavior according to the 4 Nashport Expectations. These students receive a certificate and enjoy Donald's donuts with Mrs. Knowlton and Mrs. Spiker. In addition to rewarding student behavior, Nashport staff are celebrating when students reach their Accelerated Reader goals each quarter. Students who meet grade level goals for Accelerated Reader will earn a special reward throughout the school year.

SOCIAL MEDIA DANGERS

This was an educational opportunity for each child to learn some mature themes that have been thrust upon children given the use of social media and smartphones / electronic devices. Law enforcement discussed the dangers & pitfalls of social media platforms and electronic media with our students. The presentation discussed themes with the students involving the law and consequences of non-compliance. This presentation is designed to provide greater education about the legal aspects and ramifications of inappropriate social media activity, while having dialogue & greater understanding about the classifications of felony crimes and misdemeanors.


CDL SIMULATOR

They taught everyone how to stay safe in case of a fire, answered questions, shared stories from their experiences, and emphasized the importance of being prepared. The highlight for students was getting to explore the fire truck and seeing the tools they use in emergencies. Adamsville Elementary kindergarten classes had a field trip to the Adamsville fire station. The visit wrapped up a lessons on fire safety, and students were excited to see what they'd been learning come to life. Firefighters gave the students a special tour, showing them important equipment used to fight fires. Students enjoyed the experience of climbing aboard a real fire truck. NATIONAL FFA CONVENTION

The Tri-Valley FFA attended the 98th National FFA Convention & Expo in Indianapolis October 28th - November 1st. One alumni, Izabella Lazar received her American FFA Degree. The American Degree is the highest honor an FFA member can receive. The National Convention gives FFA members the opportunity to meet fellow members from around the country. FFA members had a great time touring agribusinesses, meeting with college reps, attending sessions led by national motivational speakers, and making many fond memories together.

American FFA Degree Requirements

1. Have received the State FFA Degree
2. Complete the equivalent of 3yrs. (540 hrs) in Agricultural Education or 360 hrs in Agricultural Education and 1yr postsecondary Agricultural Education
3. Graduated from High School
4. Maintained records to exhibit comprehensive planning, managerial & financial expertise
5. Earned \$10,000 and invested \$7,500 or earned \$2,000 and worked 2,250 hrs.
6. Produce record of outstanding leadership abilities and community involvement and achieve a high school scholastic record
7. Participate in a minimum of 50 hrs community service within 3 different community service activities





CHILD FIND - A SEARCH FOR ALL CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

Every school district has the responsibility of seeking out and identifying children in need of special education services. Although school-age children are identified through each building's intervention assistance team and referral process, parents of children not yet enrolled, who reside within the Tri-Valley Local Schools boundaries, may not be aware that services are available.

What does a disability mean:

For ages birth to 3: an established condition known to result in delay or a developmental delay.

For ages 3-5: a documented deficit in one or more of the following developmental areas:

communication	vision
hearing	motor skills
self-help skills	cognitive skills
social/emotional/behavioral functioning	

For ages 5-21: identification of one or more of the following conditions

autism
hearing impairment including deafness
Intellectual disability
multiple disabilities
orthopedic impairment
other health impairment
emotional disturbance
specific learning disabilities
speech or language impairment
traumatic brain injury
visual impairment including blindness
