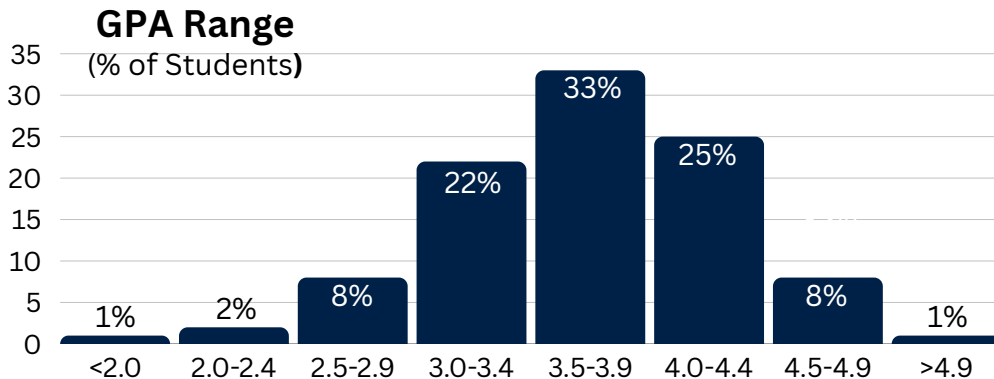

Curriculum Features:

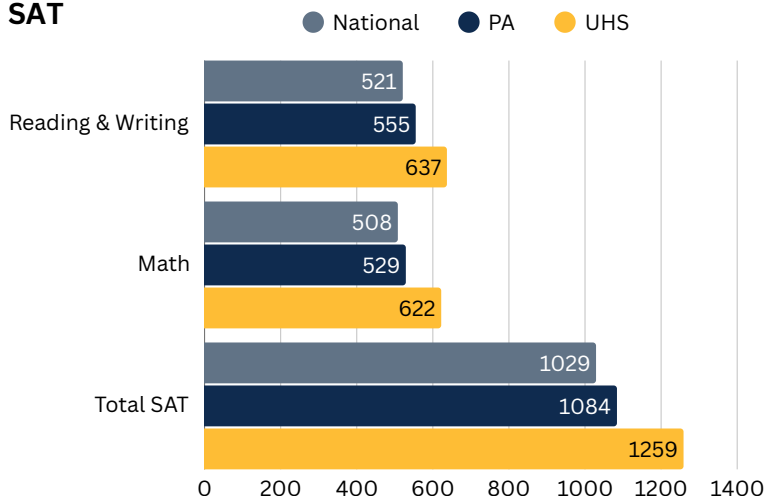
- UHS offers a **challenging college preparatory curriculum** that encompasses a variety of classes: Academic, Honors, Advanced Placement (AP); and Dual Enrollment.
- UHS calculates and reports **cumulative GPA on a weighted 4.0 scale**, with one quality point added for AP courses and .5 added for honors courses. Courses taken outside of UHS are not calculated into students' GPA.
- **UHS does not report class rank.**
- Students have **seven class periods per day.**
- To graduate, students must earn a **minimum of 22 credits** and **demonstrate proficiency on the Keystone Exam** in Biology, Algebra, and Literature.
- UHS offers students the option to take a variety of classes in a **blended format** that combines traditional and online instruction, with three days in the classroom and three days online. Blended courses are taught by UHS faculty and match traditional courses in rigor and time investment. Blended classes are indicated as such on students' transcripts.
- UHS offers **dual enrollment courses** through West Chester University and Chester County Technical College High School (TCHS).
- In partnership with the Chester County Intermediate Unit's Brandywine Virtual Academy (BVA), UHS offers a **virtual school called Unionville-Chadds Ford Virtual Academy**. Students complete coursework through BVA and earn a UHS diploma. BVA is PDE-approved.

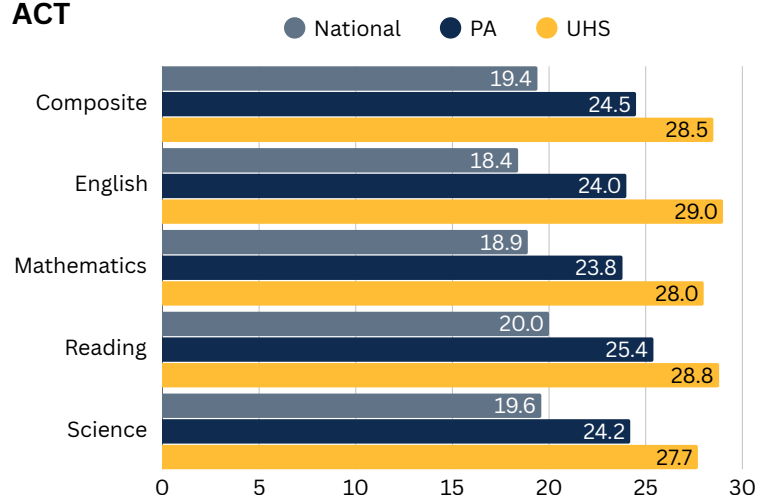

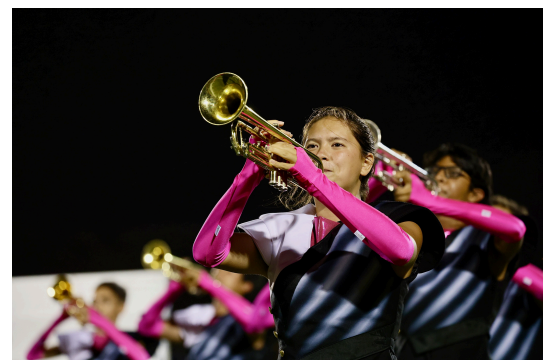
Extracurricular Offerings:

- In addition to our extensive art and music course offerings, all students have the option to participate in extracurricular programming in the areas of art, drama, dance, and music.
- The drama department puts on multiple productions each year.
- Our music department includes choir, band, and orchestra at the academic and honors levels.
- Advanced ensembles are audition-based and regularly place in local and national competitions.



Athletics

College Placement:

In 2025, 93% of graduates chose to continue their education at college, 88% at a 4-year college and 5% at a 2-year college. The remaining 7% enrolled in the military, sought employment, or took a gap year. Our college bound students went to 120 schools across 34 states and territories.
