Critical Initiatives

- Teachers will collaborate in grade level teams to plan instruction, design common assessments, and analyze student data.
- Substitute teachers will be utilized to allow teachers a full day of reading/math planning. Stipends will be provided for hours outside of contract.
- MTSS/RTI- Teachers and members of the committee develop an intervention plan to target behavior and academics. Parents, teachers, and students are familiar with the plan and the outcome.
- ELA Parent Night and/or Literacy Brunch was held to discuss the Literacy Act for 2nd and 3rd graders.

- K-6 Math Coach/ AMSTI/ Kids First- Coach will be utilized to provide professional development, instructional strategies, and resources to enhance student achievement.
