- Ursuline's modular schedule encourages the building of community, providing opportunities for interaction with a variety of classmates inside and outside of the classroom.
- The availability of 300 leadership positions empowers our students to develop confidence, voice, and agency, significantly shaping their academic and personal success.
- Ursuline fields 27 teams in 13 sports, with nearly 60% of our students participating in our athletic program.
- Ursuline students completed 12,727 hours of community service during the 2024-2025 school year, averaging 26 hours per student.
- Students can choose to get involved in any of our 30 student-run clubs and organizations.
- Our extensive alumnae network provides valuable connections to students throughout their life journey.

## ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- More than 125 unique courses are offered at three academic levels, twenty-five of these courses are Advanced Placement.
- Student schedules are built upon a modular framework, creating flexibility and depth in student scheduling that cannot be arranged at other schools.
- Students participate in counseling courses, which are tailored to the needs for each grade. 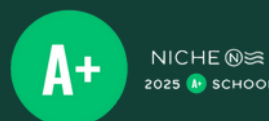

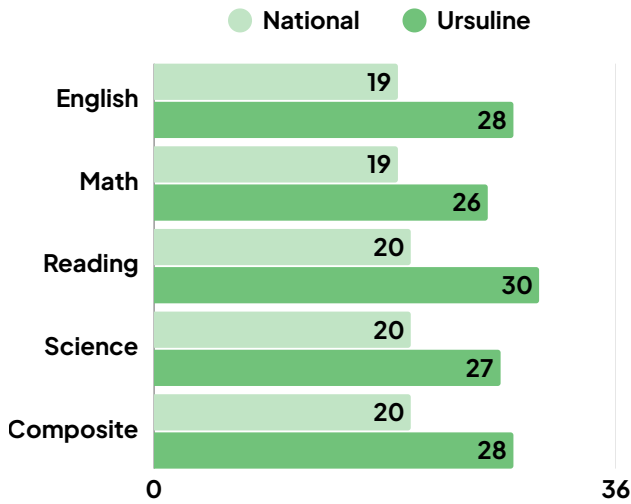

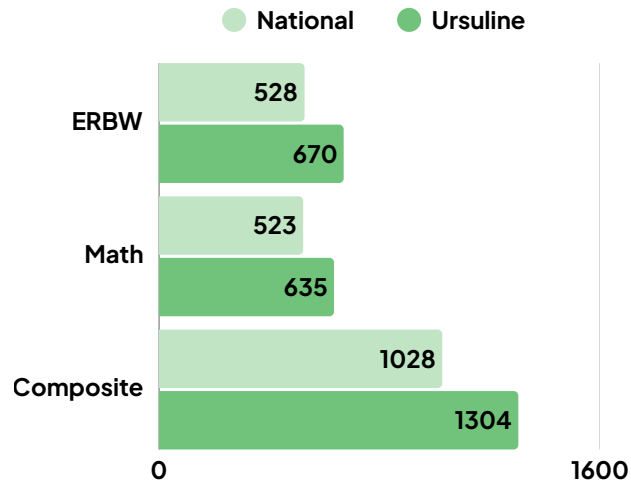
