*The Board met on November 3 for a Work Session Meeting and on November 10 for a Voting Meeting. The Board approved various field trips, personnel, the first reading of policies, and heard financial updates.*

### PRESENTATIONS

#### **Hampton Middle School: PBIS Lunch Lounge**

Dr. Lux, Mr. Rice, and Mr. Geary, along with six former 8th grade students (Nora Mauro, Maya Regotti, Carson Ohodnicki, Madelyn Zavidny, Reese Goldstein, and Anna Bukovac) presented their completed PBIS Lunch Lounge project, which was largely funded through an HAEE grant. The students presented their creative process, including how they worked within the budget and collaboratively with each other. Dr. Lux explained the project-based learning model behind the project, with Mr. Geary overseeing their design process and the actual construction of the space. The finalized space serves as an entertaining and relaxing area for students, who are selected from a drawing of students who have demonstrated responsibility, respect, and a motivation to learn. During their lunch period, winning students are able to relax and enjoy the dedicated lunch lounge space in the middle school cafeteria.

#### **Student Council Representatives**

Daniela Khoury and Maddy Rossi, junior Student Council representatives, gave the monthly report. They shared that fall sports were very successful, and many teams made it to state competitions. They reported that the first quarter has ended at HHS, and

that the students are happy with the Lunch and Learn model. Student Council is currently shifting its focus to Thon preparations, educating students on the reason behind Thon, and how the funds will be used.

#### **Hampton High School: College Admissions Overview**

Dr. Thornton and Mr. Combi presented a college admissions overview. Mr. Combi discussed the various supports which are available to students to help them on their college admissions journeys including the support available for financial aid and FAFSA completion. They also presented data regarding student applications and acceptances as well as college statistics for the Class of 2025 (78% of graduating seniors attended 4-yearschoools and 10% of graduating seniors attended 2-year programs).

#### **Public Comment**

Mrs. Hamlin opened the meeting up for public comment. Three community members commented on the district's safety and security program, school resource officer, and requested an additional safety and security public meeting to address their specific concerns.

Student Affairs Matt Jarrell presented and the Board unanimously approved the Hampton High School Marching Band Field Trip to the Norfolk NATO Parade of Nations in Norfolk, Virginia, April 22 - 25, 2027, at no cost to the district, and the Varsity Wrestling Field Trip to the Fred Bell Wrestling Tournament at Grove City High School, at no cost to the district.
