•Marching Foxes Win First Place at PIMBA Championships

The Fox Chapel Area High School Marching Band won first place at the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Marching Band Association (PIMBA) Championships. The Marching Foxes placed first in Class 2A at the competition which was held October 18, 2025, at Deer Lakes High School. The Marching Foxes earned a score of 86.375, and also won awards for the highest Music and General Effect. The theme of this year's show was "From the Ashes."

The band is under the student direction of drum majors senior **Sophia Nguansiri** and junior **Nadre Digbohau**, and band directors/teachers **Daryl Lesnik**, **Evan Hertrick**, **Joshua Branker**, and **Karli Umholtz**.

•High School Students Place at Lake Erie Speech & Debate Tournament

Seven Fox Chapel Area High School students placed at the annual M&M Lake Erie Invitational Speech and Debate Tournament. The debate teams of senior **Joanna Li** and junior **Emmanuella Ulas** and juniors **Elaine Huang** and **Lydia Humes** won second place in the Team Sweepstakes for Debate for their combined records in Parliamentary Debate. The team of sophomores **Paulomi Goel** and **Ottilie Happold** won second place in Duo Interpretation. Sophomore **Abigail Vaughan** won fifth place in Student Congress.

The tournament, sponsored by Mercyhurst Preparatory School and McDowell High School, was held November 8, 2025, on the campus of Penn State Behrend in Erie, Pennsylvania. A total of 124 students from 8 public and private high schools from Western Pennsylvania participated in the event.

•High School Students Win Award at Western PA Novice Speech and Debate Tournament

Two Fox Chapel Area High School students placed at the annual Western Pennsylvania Novice Speech and Debate Tournament. The team of sophomores **Carter Fincher** and **Amelia Tedesco** won third place overall in Parliamentary Debate.

The tournament was held at Peters Township High School October 25, 2025. A total of 241 students representing 15 public, private, and charter high schools from across the region participated in the competition.

•High School Student Places at UVA Model UN Conference

A Fox Chapel Area High School student won an award at the 45th Annual University of Virginia Model UN Conference. Senior **Ori Goldin** was awarded a Verbal Commendation (equivalent to fourth place).

Nearly 950 students from 61 public, private, and charter schools from 10 states participated in the conference, held November 14-16, 2025, at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville.

The purpose of the Model UN conferences is to enable students to role-play and simulate the countries in the United Nations. As a part of the conferences, students debate and try to solve global problems from the perspectives of other countries.

•Student Places at Riverview Model United Nations (UN) Conference

A Fox Chapel Area High School senior placed at the 14th annual Riverview Model UN Conference. **Ori Goldin** won the Outstanding Delegate award (equivalent to second place).

Approximately 160 students from 12 schools participated in the Riverview Model UN Conference. The competition was held October 13, 2025, at Riverview High School in Oakmont.

• **Boys Soccer Player Named to All-State Team**

Fox Chapel Area High School senior **Rocco Didomenico** was named to the Western Pennsylvania Soccer Coaches Association (WPSCA) All-State team. The members of the team were selected by the coaches.
