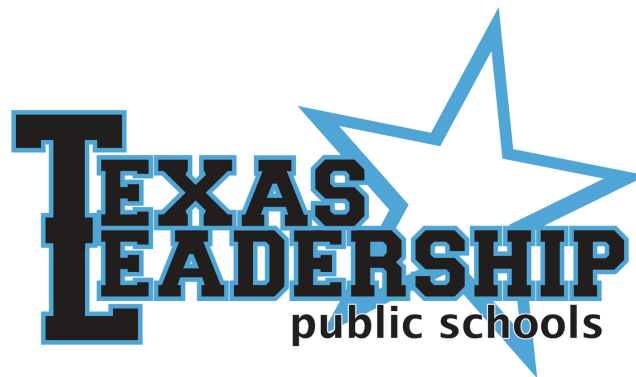
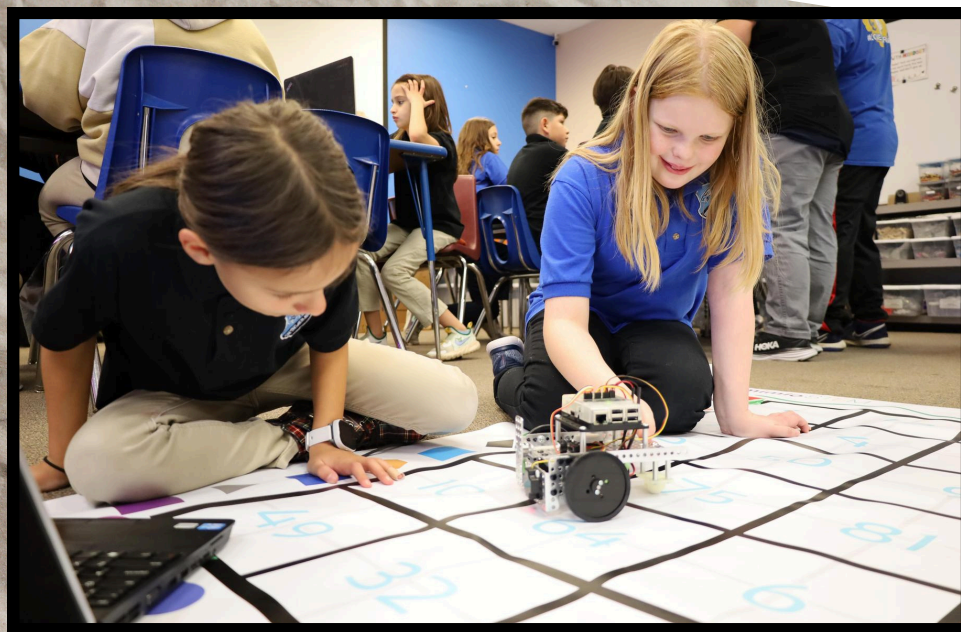

PARENT-SCHOOL COMPACT

We work with parents to create an agreement that explains how to help your child succeed in school. We'll keep a copy on file so it's easy to find when needed. Each year, we'll look at the agreement together to see if any changes or updates would be helpful. This partnership agreement helps make sure everyone is on the same page about supporting your child's education and academic growth.

COMMUNICATION



We want to work with you as equal partners in your child's education. To make this happen, we're training our teachers, principals, and staff on how to better communicate and collaborate with families, as well as parent to parent support. - Speak limited English, have a child with disabilities, or are part of a migrant family

PARENT ROLE IN CREATING THE PLAN

Texas Leadership Public Schools will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance for students in PK-12.

- Campus visitation by Title I coordinators from the district level to serve in an advisory capacity to Title I campuses and to support high quality PreK programs.
- A district parent advisory council to provide advice on all matters related to parental involvement in Title I, Part A programs and high quality PreK programs.
- A district meeting of parents/caregivers, community members and campus personnel to provide feedback and input on campus plans, policies and budget allocations
- Appropriate roles for community-based organizations and businesses, including faith-based organizations, in parental involvement activities

Texas Leadership Public Schools will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its district/school/PreK parent involvement plan:

- Actively recruit parents/Pre-K caregivers to participate in parent advisory capacity
- Schedule meetings at convenient times and locations to participate in a comprehensive review of policy, budget and programs for parent involvement
- Establish a task force to implement parent involvement activities and initiatives
- Offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and provide transportation, child care, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement
- Facilitate communication between parents/caregivers and Title I campuses

ANNUAL TITLE I PARENT MEETINGS

Texas Leadership Public Schools uses special federal money (called Title I funds) to help all students succeed.

What We Do:

- Each Title I school holds at least one meeting every year to explain what services we offer, how they work, and share the network of resources that we have available in our community.

- These documents are available in English, Spanish, and other languages if you need them:

We understand parents have busy schedules, so we offer:

- Meetings at different times of day
- Virtual meetings online

- We will provide translators for parents who don't speak English

What is Title I?

Title I is a federal program that gives extra support to schools with high numbers of students from low-income families. The goal is to make sure every child has a fair and equal chance to succeed in school. Title I helps pay for things like extra teachers, tutoring programs, and family engagement activities—so that parents and schools can work together to help all students do their best.

CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

Our teachers, PK-12, will receive ongoing professional development throughout the year to support and use diverse and research based instructional strategies to enhance student achievement in all classroom settings.
