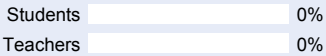

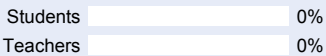

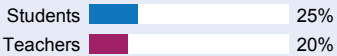

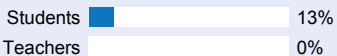

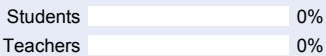

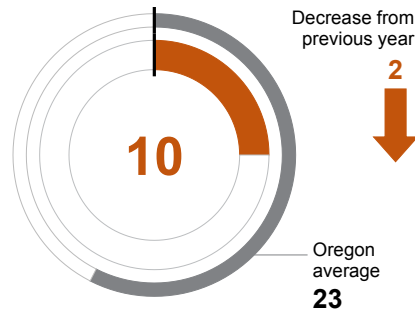

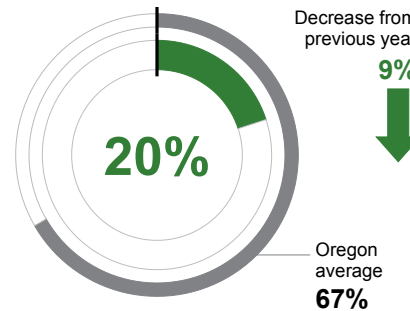
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

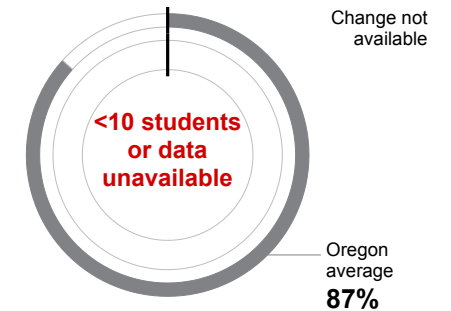
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

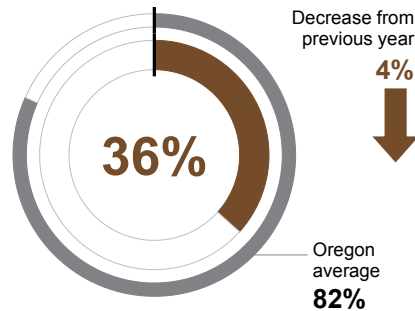
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

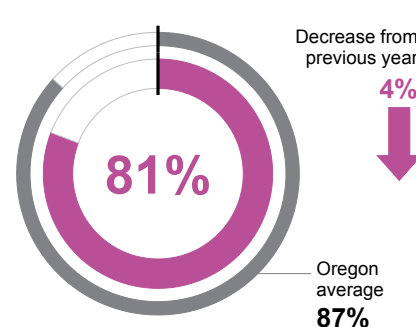
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2020-21 graduating in 2023-24.



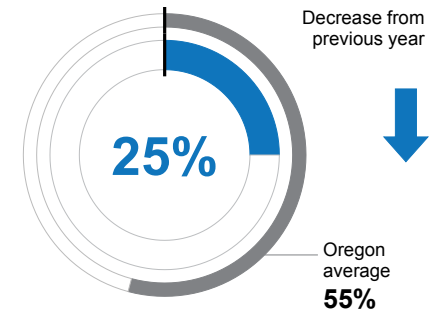
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

AOS is dedicated to providing students with a smaller learning environment, social and emotional stability, support, and a variety of programs and opportunities for students to meet their educational goals. The goals include: Increasing graduation and completion rates; Improve student attendance across all programs. Lastly, all students will have the opportunity to develop a post-secondary plan prior to graduating.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is collaborating with school districts and communities across the state to achieve a 90% on-time graduation rate by 2027. Grounded in the pillars of Academic Excellence, Belonging and Wellness, and Reimagined Accountability, ODE prioritizes evidence-based practices to boost early literacy, attendance, and student engagement. We are committed to closing opportunity and achievement gaps for marginalized students and securing long-term success for all of Oregon's learners by investing in culturally responsive practices, fostering inclusive environments and always driving for continuous improvement.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

AOS is committed to providing a safe and welcoming school by providing a smaller learning environment, a focus on relationships, and a unique schooling experience. School data shows that 93% of students report feeling safe in all of their classes, and when asked to describe their relationships at school, the highest reported responses included that the staff were supportive, respectful, helpful, and trusting. Parents and guardians overwhelmingly reported their experience with AOS to be supportive, trusting, and respectful.
