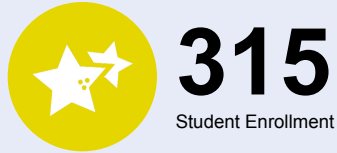

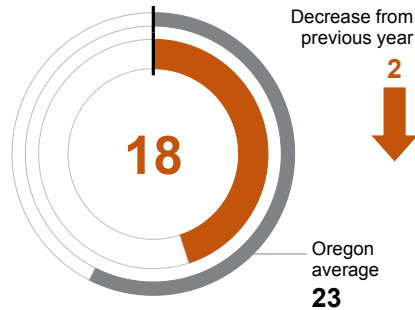

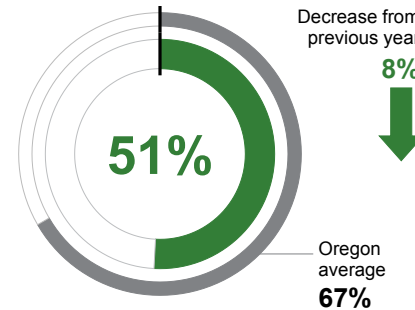

CLASS SIZE Median class size.



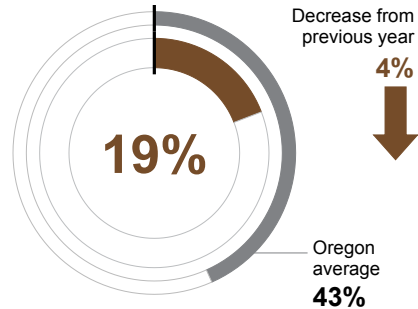
REGULAR ATTENDERS Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

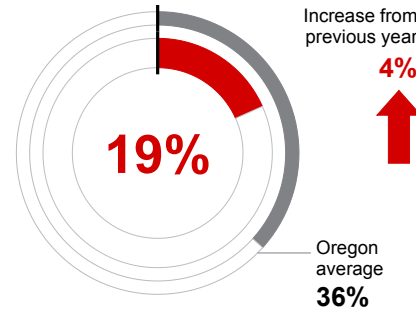
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



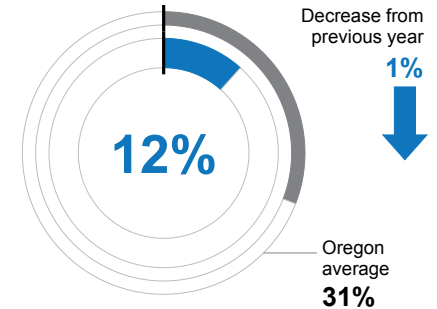
MATHEMATICS

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Student and staff safety are the most important aspects of Sunrise. The Sunrise Way - a set of expectations for Respect, Responsibility, and Safety - is thoroughly taught in every part of the school. We promote positive social interactions with daily Social-Emotional Learning time at the start of each school day. All staff are trained to respond quickly to any behavior concerns. In our parent survey in November 2023, 96% of parents said, "Students generally feel safe at the school."

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Sunrise is home to a variety of clubs and extracurricular opportunities for students. We regularly encourage students to participate in activities such as our Garden Club, Talent Show, Wellness Night, Family Movie Night, and Student Leadership.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Parents and guardians are our key partners in education! Our Parent Teacher Team works hand-in-hand with staff to promote success for students. Recent events have included Pastries with Parents, Talent Show, Family Movie Night, Science Night, Literacy Night, Wellness Night, Field Day, and English Language Development (ELD) Family Night. Parents with approved background checks are encouraged to volunteer in our school and to chaperone field trips.
