Uniquely International

Founded in 1991 by teachers responding to a competitive grant, International School believes confidence comes from competence. Students experience a rigorous academic climate in a nurturing environment. International's small size and 7-year program foster interpersonal relationships with both peers and faculty, promoting mutual respect among diverse viewpoints.

Admission

Students enter International School, one of eight high schools in Bellevue School District, by choice. Admission is by lottery of 5th grade applicants living within district boundaries without regard to financial or academic ability. Approximately 92 students are admitted from an applicant pool of 650+ including priority admittance for siblings of enrolled students. Our seven-year program, sibling policy, and offsite overnight high school retreat contribute to a powerful sense of belonging within the school community.

Curriculum

Students study seven core subjects for 7 years (“7x7”). Through the internationally integrated curriculum, students achieve mastery, elevate critical thinking, and develop cross-cultural competence. Subjects are: Fine Arts, French, Humanities, International Studies, Math, Physical Education, and Science. The curriculum emphasizes depth of learning and development of persistence, including in traditionally non-academic areas. For most subjects, students follow a prescribed sequence. Beginning junior year, students may choose among math and science courses but must take one of each. Computer Science courses are available in 11th and 12th grades.

Extra-Curricular Activities

International has 4 student body leadership teams, 10 honor societies, and 20+ clubs. High schoolers are not offered sports at International. Senior Project

Every International School second semester senior designs and executes a unique project driven by intellectual curiosity and sense of public service. Students are guided by adult mentors who are experts in the chosen field of study. In addition to 50 hours of work, seniors complete 10 hours of real-world engagement outside the school community, deliver a final portfolio presentation using PowerPoint, and field questions from adult panelists. This experiential learning is unique to International School students and is a culmination of learning that prepares students for life after high school. Past examples include 3D printed prosthetic hand, bee keeping, birth control video, building a hydrogen fuel cell, cultural dance choreography, publishing a children's book, homeless youth advocacy, snow ski fabrication, and watershed restoration.

Focus Week

Every May, classes at International are paused for a one-week deep-dive into one or more educational area: industrial arts, home and family life, business and office, health occupations, vocational, trade and industrial, technical, and career. This pivot to hands-on and experiential learning leverages students' interests to expand their perspectives and skills. High school students earn .25 Career and Technical Education credit each year in this exclusive program to meet the 1.0 CTE graduation requirement.

Grading: students earn S for full participation and NC if unable to earn credit due to absence.

INTERNATIONAL RIGOR: Advanced Placement, College in the High School, CTE Dual Credit, and beyond

Most course sequences culminate with an AP or higher course. Students are eligible for college credit through AP and CHS (∞) courses. Most students can take at least 8 out of the 14 AP courses offered beginning in 10th grade. 100% of students take at least one AP course. AP and CHS are college-level coursework and equally rigorous. Credits in () are higher than standard 1.0 credit/year.
