Diversity is reflected not only in the student body but also in the staff/administration. There is a blending of 63 national and international educators - 59% Jamaican, 22% American and 19% are third-country nationals from Canada, UK, Spain, France, Dominica, Barbados, Trinidad and Romania. 67% of our educators have earned a Masters or PhD degree.

CALENDAR

The school calendar includes two semesters. Semester 1 starts in August and ends in January. Semester 2 commences in January and finishes in June. Total school days are 181. The school day starts at 7:45 AM and ends at 3:00 PM for all students.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

AISK is a Preschool through Grade 12 independent, international school with a diverse student body of college-bound students. Having both US and IBO Accreditation, all students earn an HS Diploma and most students earn an IB Diploma. The academic program provides for studying the IB Diploma, or a selection of IB courses and High School Courses. Classes are small and interactive requiring students to develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Honors classes are offered in Mathematics in Grades 9 and 10. Arts are important at AISK and students may choose Visual Arts or any of our Performing Arts: Theater, Music, or Dance. Classes in both French and Spanish are also offered.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

AISK is a venue for artistic, musical, and dramatic productions as well as intramural and extramural sports events. Varsity sports are football, basketball, tennis, swimming, and dance. Clubs include Student Government, National Honor Society, Model United Nations, Chess, Coding, and many more.

GRADING SYSTEM

GPA is calculated for Grades 9-12. A 4-point scale (A-4, B-3, C-2, and D-1) is utilized and only grades earned at AISK are factored into the GPA. IB courses are weighted with .3.
