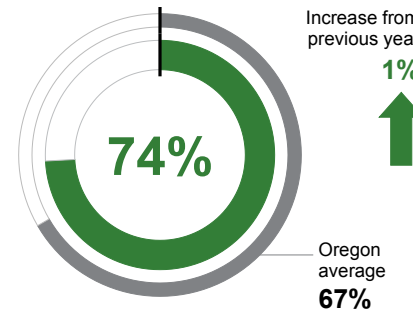
CLASS SIZE

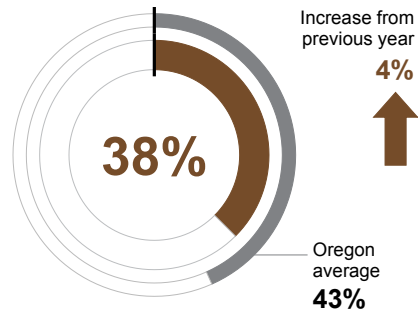

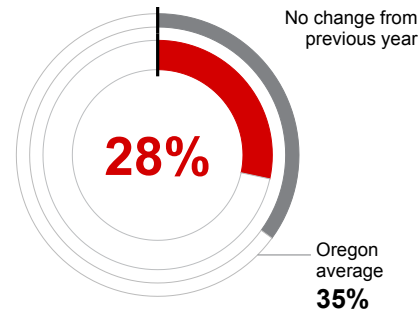

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



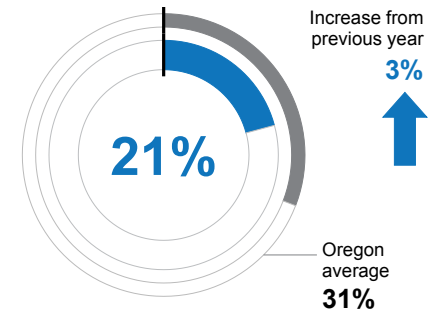
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

At Tobias, we believe that all students can grow academically and socially. We are focused on strengthening our core instruction in language arts, math, and academic language development. We also use differentiated, small-group instruction to meet specific students' needs. We enhance students' social-emotional skills during morning meetings, through social-emotional lessons, and by building connections within the school community. In doing so, we will ensure all students have consistent access and support needed to build and extend their academic and social skills.

Students learn best when they feel safe and valued. Classes hold daily morning meetings where staff and students create strong relationships and practice positive social interactions. Tobias uses buddy classes to build positive relationships with students across grade levels. We have a schoolwide leadership program that celebrates school leaders in all grades, and we elevate student voice through our 6th grade leadership group.

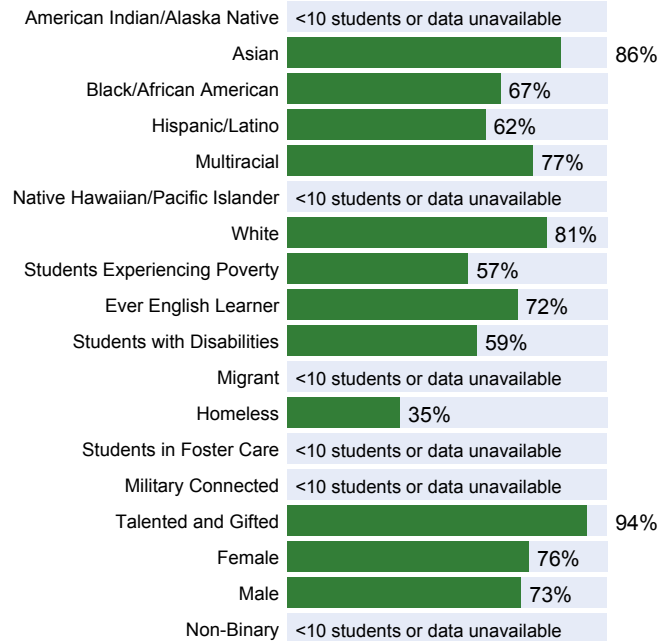

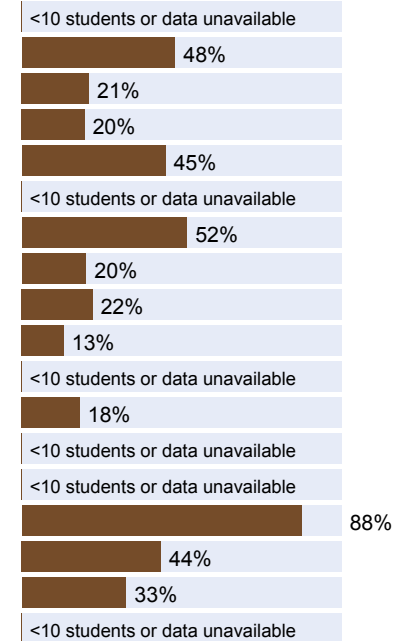

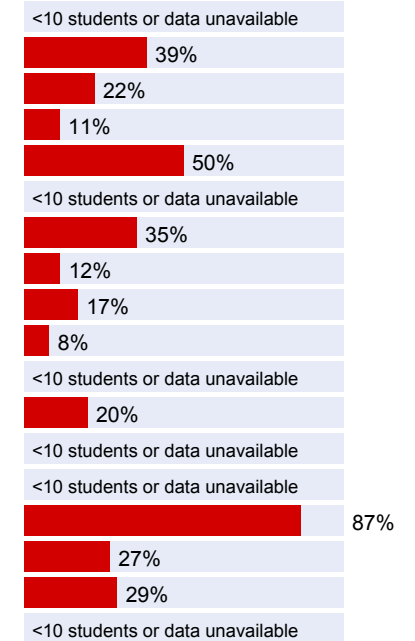

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Our number one priority and goal is to ensure students are safe, and we do not tolerate bullying or harassment. We have a network of adults, systems, structures, protocols, and other supports we leverage to keep our school as safe as possible. Staff at Tobias are trained on the bullying and harassment prevention policies we have in place, as well as the systems we use to support students. Additionally, we teach students how to identify and interrupt harmful situations and report these incidents to an adult.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Tobias has a number of after-school clubs available to students. Some of these activities include a running club that culminates in a district track meet, STEAM clubs, gardening, coding, beading, band for 6th grade, Battle of the Books, and Chess Club. We would love to add more clubs in the upcoming school year, and we are always looking for more volunteers and community partnerships to assist us in that endeavor.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

We believe a strong connection between school and home is an important aspect of our students' success. We have Principal Coffee Chats, where caregivers are invited to attend and discuss topics related to Tobias and the Hillsboro School District. We send out a bi-weekly newsletter to keep families up-to-date with what is going on at our school. Tobias has started a Diverse Family Group that focuses on hearing the experiences of families and partnering with them to make the school a more inclusive space. Our Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) raises funds to enrich the academic experience of students and is always looking for new members to join them.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We are fortunate to be part of a community that actively supports student learning. Our partners include CAIRO, Washington County Sheriff's Department, Junior Achievement, Portland Metro STEM Partnership, Clean Water Services, and NW Outdoor School. These partnerships provide our students with access to field trips and other community-based learning opportunities. Tobias has a Care Team that meets to determine student needs and connect them to community resources and supports. We have a Community Care Specialist, who furthers our work in community engagement. We welcome donations of school supplies, clothing, and snacks throughout the year to support students and families.
