In April, the team won the Sweepstakes Award at the TAPPS State FTC Robotics Championship in Waco, Texas. In April, the team offered an outreach STEM Day at St. Francis de Sales Catholic School. The WOW Robotics ladies led eight different STEM activities that students from all grade levels were able to participate in. We hope that this day inspired a love of STEM!

At the end of the school year, the IWA Robotics Team was presented with the **Sr. Jeanne de Matel Award** for outstanding dedication, perseverance and excellence in Robotics teamwork and for bringing honor and recognition to Incarnate Word.

OPPORTUNITIES TO LEAD

During my time at IWA, I found a wide range of opportunities to lead: I served as captain of the tennis team, co-president of Stitching Sisters and STEM+, helped lead freshman orientation and was an active member of several other school clubs and organizations.

One of my most meaningful leadership roles was serving as a Falcon Ambassador.

As a Falcon Ambassador, I supported the Admissions Department by giving prospective student tours, assisting with our annual Open House and helping with other admissions events.

FAVORITE EXPERIENCE

GROWTH

While at Incarnate Word, I was able to dive deep into the sciences and truly discover where my passions lie. KEY TAKEAWAY

The close, supportive environment at IWA has had a profound impact on my growth. The individualized attention they provide fosters meaningful personal development and I know I've grown significantly since my freshman year, thanks in large part to their guidance and dedication.

OPPORTUNITIES TO LEAD

I'm a naturally quiet person, so leadership wasn't something I expected to pursue. The summer before senior year, a friend asked me if I wanted to start a chess club with her. Organizing the club added another responsibility to an already busy school year, but we managed to balance our workloads and successfully run the club.

This experience proved invaluable to me as a leader.

FAVORITE EXPERIENCE

I have had many wonderful experiences at IWA, which provides much more than just a basic education. Its downtown location allows students to easily visit places like Discovery Green (DG) for picnics, the George R. Brown Convention Center or PWC for leadership events, and even attend Astros games or performances such as The Nutcracker at the Wortham Theater Center. The Heart of Champions

I'm in my 24th year as athletic director at Incarnate Word Academy. Looking back on my time here, it is incredible to see how much we have grown since then. In 2001, we only had five sports available for the girls to play: basketball, cross country, softball, track and volleyball.

Now, we are proud to offer ten different sports for our girls. Each team has been remarkably successful, competing in championships and having girls qualify for TAPPS at the state level. We also have eleven former students still competing at the college level. In May 2025, Kendy Taylor signed at Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas, to continue cheerleading. This was the very first time one of our girls has signed for cheer and we are thrilled!

Forty percent of our total student body participates in at least one sport, with many girls excelling in multiple sports. This involvement showcases their passion for athletics while also maintaining strong academic performance. When middle school students visit IWA for tours, they witness firsthand the welcoming environment of their future teammates in nine different sports. If they have the talent and dedication, our coaches are sure to recognize it. We have even had freshmen who performed exceptionally well, allowing them to join the varsity teams—an opportunity that is often unlikely in larger schools. IWA is fortunate to offer its students the opportunity to actively participate in sports, making it an integral part of their overall high school experience.

Many of our student athletes are enrolled in honors level classes and AP/Dual Credit classes, where they make use of the valuable life skills that participating in a sport has helped to instill in them. Some of the skills that the girls learn include teamwork, discipline, resilience and time management. Our girls are champions on and off the field, and we couldn't be more proud of them!

Cross Country

Throughout the summer, our Falcons were hard at work preparing for the 2025–2026 school year. The girls joined St. Agnes in Memorial Park to train together. Although the IWA Falcons and St. Agnes Tigers are rivals, they help push each other to train better and work harder. Competition season began on August 16, as IWA hosted the 15th Annual Cross Country Invitational at Challengers Seven Memorial Park. Mary Brush, '28, finished in 11th place and Clementine Wells, '29, finished in 12th place. On Friday, August 29, the team attended South Houston Invitational at Crenshaw Park in Pasadena, Texas. Vivian Espinoza, '27, finished in first place! Mary Brush, '28, placed seventh and Clementine Wells, '29, placed in eighth. We are so proud of our team! They competed in the district meet on October 18 at The Woodlands Christian Academy.

Volleyball

Our Volleyball team was also training hard over the summer, with camps taking place from July 21–24 here at IWA. This summer we had more camp participants than ever before. Tryouts took place August 4 and 5 and we have 30 incredible athletes across our Freshman, Junior Varsity and Varsity teams. We have four seniors on our Varsity team this year, Elizabeth Carter, Margaret Duncan, Brigid Flaherty and Olive Focke. Head Coach Britni Villareal is back with us again for her third year and is looking forward to a great season. Competition within our district began on September 25 here at IWA, with our girls competing against St. Pius X High School.

Basketball

Our basketball camp took place July 14–17. This was the first time in 15 years that IWA has had a summer basketball camp, an incredible milestone for us! Broderick Williams, our first-year head coach, is expecting great things for this season. Margaret Duncan, '26, and Brielle Reagins, '26, will be leading the team. Kennedy Trahan, '20, IWA's Admissions Outreach Coordinator, will also serve as assistant coach for the basketball team and head coach for the JV team. We are thrilled to have her with us!

Soccer

Our Head Coach Jenny Smith is looking forward to a strong soccer season! The team is led by seniors Brigid Flaherty, Claire Hayes, Victoria Parker and Taran Boles. Last spring, Kate McGarvey, '25, signed a letter of intent to play soccer at Rhodes College. She checked in with us recently and let us know that she is having a great season.

Swim

Swim season began in September. The Falcons continue to train at the University of Houston's Natatorium. We congratulate our Head Coach Rachel Boyle, who welcomed a baby girl in early September. Marcela Portillo, our swim coach for the 2016–2017 season, has returned to coach our girls while Rachel is on maternity leave. Juniors Molly Burrell and Veronica Burger will be the team leaders. These trademarked College Board courses, also known as the AP Capstone program, were added to our course catalog in 2023 and 2024 to provide further opportunities for students to use their foundational leadership skills to make real, relevant changes in the world around them. In AP Seminar, students develop ethical research and media literacy skills to holistically approach modern, relevant issues of interest to our students and effectively communicate impactful solutions to an audience.

AP Research takes these lessons a step further and walks students through the professional research process, focusing on a gap in the body of knowledge that the student will answer through original research, culminating in a 5000-word academic paper, a thesis defense before a panel of judges and the chance to publish their findings in professional journals.

“After over ten years of operation, the school’s leadership program is stronger than ever,” says Ms. Hernandez. “The program continues to empower young women to develop their individual strengths to make positive change in their communities, families and careers.”

IWA Honors First AP Capstone Graduates

Incarinate Word Academy is the first school in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston to introduce the AP Capstone Diploma program. Eleven students from the graduating class of 2025 are the first Capstone Cohort to complete both AP Seminar and AP Research with the potential to earn the AP Capstone Diploma™ in the Heart of Houston.

The AP Capstone Diploma program, comprising the two interdisciplinary project-based courses of AP Seminar and AP Research, helps students develop hard and soft skills that are essential to academic and career success. Students create research projects based on topics of personal interest and are assessed on the critical thinking, ethical research, collaboration, time management and presentation skills needed to complete their projects. “The AP Capstone program reignites curiosity in the classroom,” shared Bianca Peart, global director of the AP Capstone Diploma program. “Students are not only building essential skills for college and career success but they’re also discovering how their voices and ideas can make an impact!”

During the 2024–2025 school year, more than 160,000 students in over 3,500 schools worldwide participated in AP Capstone. Of these, approximately 27,650 students earned the AP Capstone Diploma, and 12,430 students earned the AP Seminar and Research Certificate. At Incarnate Word, 10 of the 11 students in our cohort were recognized by College Board

in some way, with 55% earning an AP Capstone Diploma compared to the global average of 17.2%.

Two students were awarded the AP Seminar and Research Certificate by earning scores of three or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research:

- Bella Martinez – “The Portrayal of a Leader: Royal Portrait of King Charles III”
- Alerice Milagrosa – “Wheelchair Accessibility in Residential Housing Design”

Two more of the students earned the title of AP Scholar with Distinction by earning a score of three or higher on at least five AP exams with a total average AP score of 3.5+:

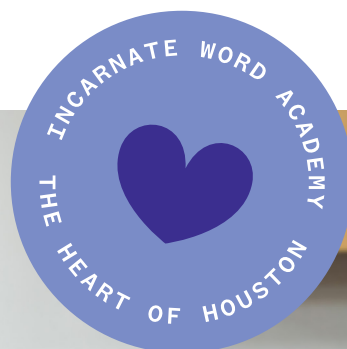
A HEART FOR TEACHING

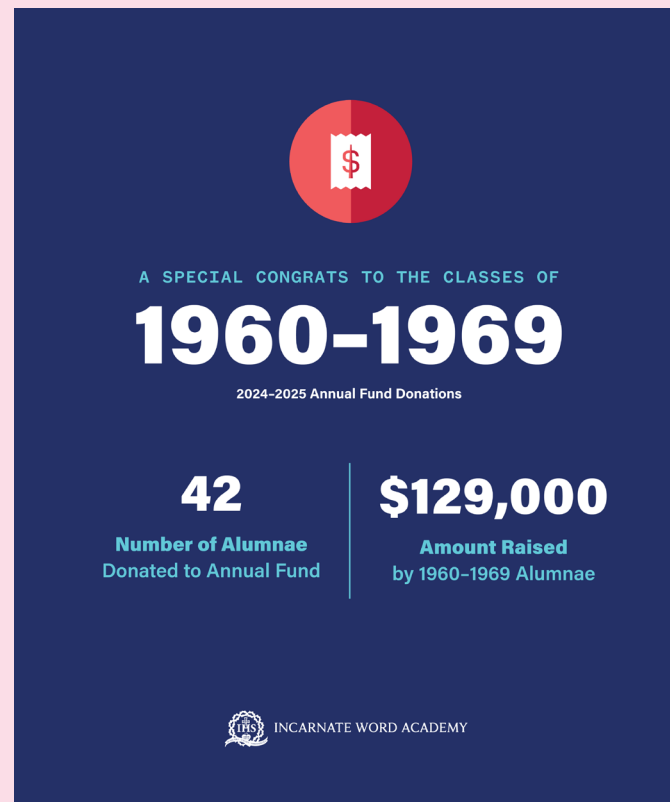

Tina Buchanan Hartsfield '86

After graduating from Incarnate Word Academy in 1986, Tina Buchanan Hartsfield began her college career at the University of Houston, where she was enrolled from 1988–1991. She graduated from the University of Louisville in 1999 with an engineering degree. “I learned most of my electrical knowledge from my father,” she says. “He owned an electrical contractor business and took me on many of his projects. His hands-on training is what I value more than any degree I have earned.”

Currently, Tina works for Amentum, a technical and engineering services company, as a Project Engineer with NASA. She began working at Kennedy Space Center (KSC) in 2017 on a federal contract. In 2022, the contract changed to Base Operations and Spaceport Services.

In April 2025, Tina received the Silver Snoopy award for improving astronaut safety.

Of all the Safe Flight Awareness Awards, the Silver Snoopy best symbolizes the intent and spirit of Space Flight Awareness. An astronaut always presents the Silver Snoopy because the recipient is chosen by a group of astronauts to highlight a colleague who exemplifies excellence and contributes to flight safety and mission success. Fewer than one percent of the aerospace program workforce receive this prestigious honor annually.

Tina earned the award after she served as the lead project manager and lead system engineer driving the Kennedy Space Center electrical line splice upgrade project. The project she was working on upgraded 3,000 existing underground power lines to significantly increase the capability, performance and reliability of NASA’s premier launch system.

The award itself [the Silver Snoopy pin] was flown on SpaceX 13 to the International Space Center (ISS) and was at the Space Station from December 17, 2017, to January 12, 2018. “The award was presented to me by Mark Vande Hei, retired United States Army officer and current NASA astronaut,” Tina says.

Besides the Silver Snoopy pin, Tina received the Silver Dollar Award in 2024, in addition to several other awards over the years. Someday she hopes to receive the Lifetime Achievement award, but she emphasizes that accolades aren’t what motivates her:

“I am just happy to continue to support the missions, not for the awards, but because I believe in the overall mission. NASA’s motto is For all Humanity!”

Tina’s values, motivation and accomplishments speak to the foundation she received at IWA.

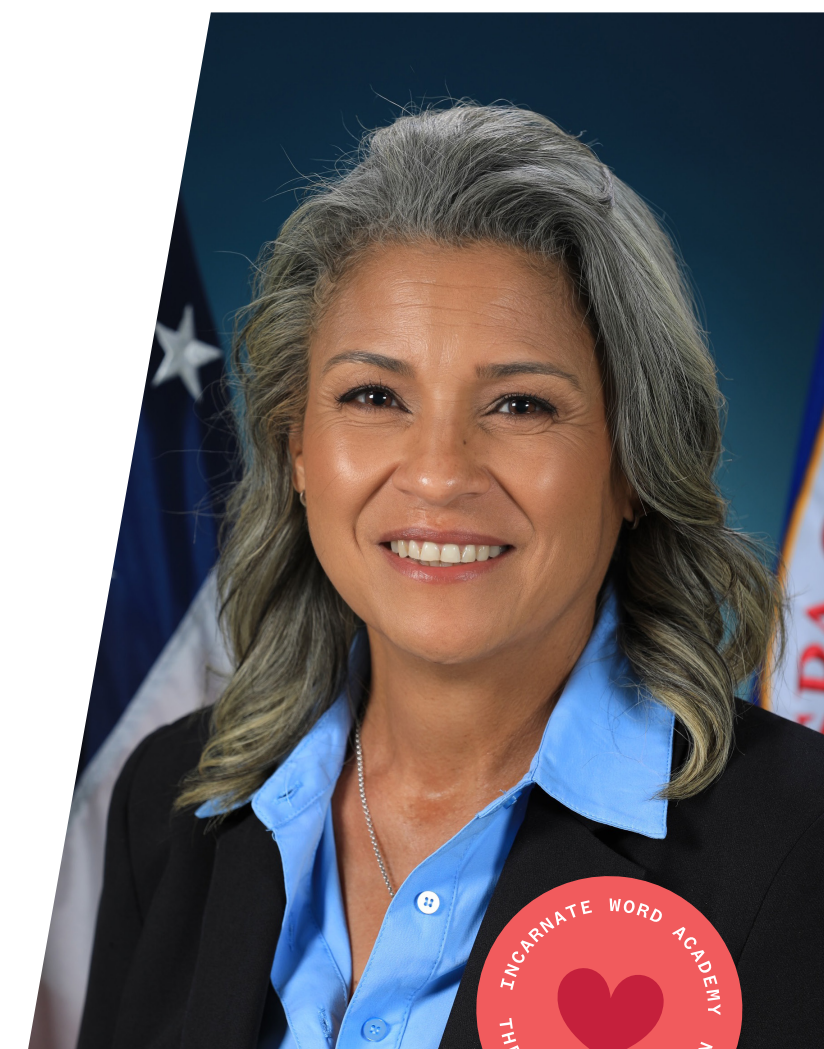
Q&A

IWA helped me to develop strong critical thinking skills, which I use every day with my role at KSC. Without IWA’s foundation, I would not be able to succeed.

Sr. Madeline was always very encouraging. Because of her support, I was able to succeed both in the classroom and outside. I learned the most from Sr. Mark Edward. She even helped me to get my first job at St. Joseph Hospital transcribing surgeon’s notes in Latin.



WHAT WAS YOUR FAVORITE EXPERIENCE AT IWA?

The best part of attending IWA was the sisterhood. I am still in touch with friends that I made during my time at Incarnate Word.

HOW HAS AN IWA EDUCATION HELPED YOU NAVIGATE A SUCCESSFUL CAREER?

The development of both critical thinking and character development that IWA helped me to develop have been crucial for my success in my career. Additionally, IWA instilled in me a strong moral compass and a sense of responsibility towards others.

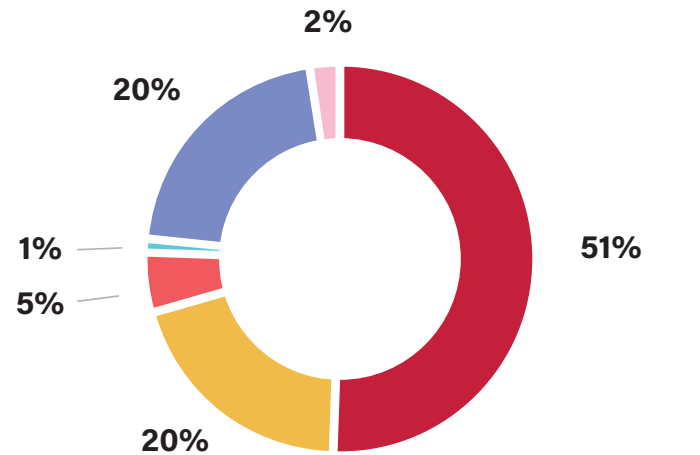

A Closer Look

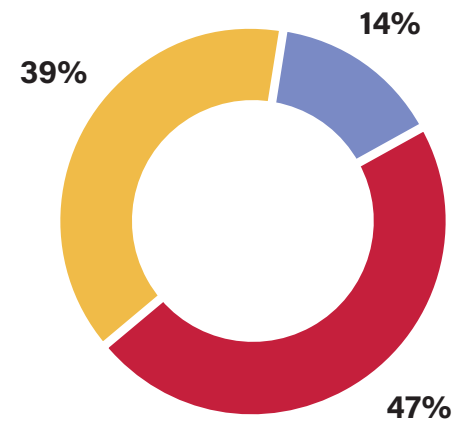
Below you will find the results for fiscal year 2024–2025. The cost to educate each student was \$31,595, while tuition was \$19,825. The difference is made up through fundraising and the generosity of donors.
