WRITING

What should my child learn in Grade 3?

- Write clearly for various reasons for different tasks, purposes, and audiences.
- Write clear, organized opinion pieces on topics or texts, supporting a point of view with reasons, facts, and details.
- Write expository texts, to inform someone about or explain a topic, using supporting facts.
- Write an interesting story with a beginning, middle, and end about something that has happened or is made up, using narrative techniques like dialogue and description.
- Learn new ideas and topics by doing research, which means gathering information from digital and print sources, taking notes about the topic, sorting the information into logical categories, and going through the writing process to compose a piece of text with illustrations and multimedia.
- Write for long and short periods of time, building stamina.

Language and Vocabulary

- Write collaboratively with peers and with teacher guidance. This includes coming up with topics and ideas with help from classmates.
- Use words and phrases that are most effective based on the audience and purpose of the writing task.

How Can I Help My Child Learn at Home?



- Provide time and space for your child to practice writing (free from distractions such as television).
- Write books together about your child's interests. The child completes a page and the parent completes a page. Create an "About the Authors" page.
- Write a comic book with your child about your child's favorite superhero or one he or she invents.
- Practice writing a user's guide about something your child knows a lot about. Show him or her a user's guide as an example.
- Use technology to help build your child's interest in writing. There are several websites where students can "publish" online writing.
