In the next couple of weeks, all K-5 students will have completed the MAP assessment. If you haven't already, please ask your Roadrunner about their goal for reading and math. If they met or exceeded their goal(s), please help us celebrate them! If not, please feel free to reach out to the classroom teacher for suggestions on how to help your student improve. As we've shared at the beginning of the year and parent conferences, teachers in K-5 send a monthly homework menu, which provides various opportunities for your student to practice what they're learning. Also, as always, we encourage reading nightly (15-20 minutes). Studies have shown a correlation between time spent reading and reading achievement. According to the National Reading Panel, ". . . the more that children read, the better their fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension."
